### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Covid-19 affected everyone, not just St. Malachy School. However, I thought I would share how we responded to the pandemic from our little corner of the world. Principals throughout the Diocese of Peoria were directed in February to establish E-Learning plans in preparation for a potential closure due to the coronavirus.

On March 12, 2020 I received notification from the Office of Catholic Schools that March 16-20 would begin a mandatory closure, not realizing it would be extended for the remainder of the school year. Therefore, on March 13, teachers instructed students to take home school materials such as spelling workbooks, math textbooks, and all necessary items to learn from home. Students left school that day with book bags filled to maximum capacity.

E-Learning began; students were excited and apprehensive about their new adventure. Parents had the option of picking up a school issued chromebook for their St. Malachy School child(ren) via a drive thru. The chromebooks were absolutely instrumental to the success of our E-Learning journey.

Thank you to each and every person who has supported St. Malachy School through donations, Car Party, Lasagna Supper, and Parents Club fundraisers. Your generosity allowed our school to deploy over 70 chromebooks to our 81 school families; however, we were equipped to provide a chromebook to each of our 113 students. In fact, families had the option to keep their chromebooks through the summer to continue learning.

Teachers and students used digital platforms and communication tools during E-Learning such as Google Classroom, SeeSaw and Zoom to assign and submit homework, post videos, hold weekly classroom meetings, and provide and receive direct instruction. I thoroughly enjoyed attending a Zoom lunch meeting with 5th and 6th grade classes!

There were many initial obstacles to E-Learning, but those subsided over time as everyone got used to a new normal and decided what worked best for their family. Our staff discussed early on in the E-Learning process that parents would face many challenges within their day such as working from home, taking care of younger siblings, and the social-emotional component of their children not being able to socialize in-person with their friends. Our staff not only provided excellent instruction, they offered constant support, understanding and kindness to our school children and families.

Thank you to our school families, who were very engaged in E-Learning. Each family's situation presented its unique set of circumstances. Therefore, staff, students and parents adopted a shared flexible mindset, combined with a commitment to quality instruction. Some students completed lessons at night after their parents returned home from work, and for others it worked best for their family's schedule to finish lessons in the morning. We also used a pass/incomplete grading model per guidance from the Office of Catholic Schools and Illinois State Board of Education. Our school families were very supportive and by working together apart, we taught our children as a family in Christ.
