



Soon we will begin the Holy Season of Advent which begins a new liturgical year for our church. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming and also leads us to the anniversary of the Lord's birth, Christmas Day. Family prayers around the Advent Wreath or other special devotions during this time help to prepare us for the Christmas Season.

Advent begins Sunday, December 1st.

Did you know you can still purchase extra copies of our wonderful <u>St. Malachy's church directory</u> in the gift shop? They would make a nice gift especially for parishioners who have moved from the area.

#### LITURGY LEANINGS FOR DECEMBER

The Liturgical year begins with Advent, December 1. Both joyful and repentant, the season prepares us for the coming of Christ as a babe and as a judge at the end of the world. We are asked to prepare, watch, and be ready, a sometimes difficult task in this busy time. The images of darkness and light parallel the darkening days of December

December 1: 1st Sunday of Advent: "...put on the Lord Jesus Christ," & watch for God's presence in our lives.

December 3: St. Francis Xavier: Jesuit and missionary to Asia, patron of missions.

December 6: St. Nicholas, fourth century bishop remembered for his acts of charity (the original Santa!), patron of sailors and children.

December 7: St. Ambrose, early Doctor of the church, patron saint of learning, beggars, and beekeepers (St. Ambrose Bees!)

December 8: Second Sunday of Advent: Isaiah's poetic description of the Messiah gives us a goal, the vision of a world of justice and peace. St. John announces the kingdom of God is at hand NOW. How might God help us to deal with the hypocrisies of both ourselves and the world to help justice flourish in our time?

December 9: Immaculate Conception is celebrated today because December 8, the usual date, is a Sunday. The Immaculate Conception is the patron of the U.S. It is not a holy day of Obligation this year. December 12: Our Lady of Guadalupe where Our Lady appears as a mestizo young woman to Juan Diego in 1531. She is the Patron of the

December 13: St. Lucy, Virgin and Martyr, whose name means "light" and is celebrated by Scandinavians as a feast of light in the dark winter.

December 14: St. John of the Cross, Priest and Doctor of the Church, Mystic and poet.

December 15: Third Sunday of Advent: Gaudete Sunday is a time of rejoicing, of bearing witness to the coming of our salvation. The visionary words of Isaiah and Paul, and John the Baptist, point our eyes towards the fulfillment of God's plan in Christ-and in us.

December 22: Fourth Sunday of Advent: As we gather closer to the Nativity, the time of waiting is coming to a close. Like Joseph, Mary, and Paul, our fears must be replaced by our trust in God, Emmanuel, "God is with us".

December 25: Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord Christmas, a new liturgical season, finally arrives. The scriptures may differ depending which mass is attended, but the message is the same: In the mystery of the Incarnation our God became human, and the message of his birth was shared with the world. We, too, must carry the light of Christ to all. "They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace."

December 26: St. Stephen, First Martyr, and patron of Deacons and altar servers.

December 27: St. John, Apostle and Evangelist, took the Virgin Mary into his home after Jesus died.

December 28: Feast of the Holy Innocents, remembering those innocent children killed by Herod, who was looking for baby Jesus.

December 29: Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph: "Blessed are they that fear the Lord; that walk in His ways."

My dear Friends,

Soon, our parishes will be conducting the appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious, an annual collection that benefits some 34,000 senior sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. As I reflect on the service of our women and men religious, I recall the words of Jesus in John's Gospel: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be" On 12:26). Through their prayer and ministries, religious can be found wherever Jesus is found-not just in Catholic parishes, schools, and hospitals, but also in service to the poor, the lonely, and the oppressed. In a profound Way, we also find Jesus in the ongoing witness of our elder religious. While many continue in active and volunteer ministry, others are frail and need assistance. Yet they remain wholly committed to their vocations, accepting the limitations of aging and embracing the opportunity to focus more fully on praying for our Church and world.

Most elder religious worked for years for small stipends, leaving a substantial gap in retirement savings. With the ever-rising cost of health care and the increase in the number of those needing care, many religious communities now struggle to provide for their senior members. The Retirement Fund for Religious offers vital financial assistance to help meet day-to-day needs forprescription medications, nursing care, and more. The annual collection is an opportunity for each of us to be the presence of Jesus to our senior religious. I ask simply that you give what you can. Please join me in supporting the Retirement Fund for Religious and in praying for God's continued blessing on our nation's elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests.
