

The COVID-19 pandemic has changed many things at our church, including some of the technology used during our Masses. There is a need for volunteers to help as camera operators during our weekend Masses and special events. We are looking for two types:

- 1) Camera Operator: Sat:5:00 Mass and Sun:10:45 Mass : Responsible for operating the camera to display the Saturday or Sunday Mass on the big screen TV in the Narthex for those who choose to distance in that area to watch the Mass. Operator instructions are available, and training will be provided.
- 2) Live Stream Operator: Sun:8:15 Mass & special occasions: This role is a bit more involved; responsible for setting up DVD recorder, connecting to our church live stream and running the camera to record the Mass to DVD, display to Facebook "Live" video feed and also display on the big screen TV in the Narthex. The Facebook live video requires logging in to our media computer, operating the video streaming software & connecting to our church Facebook page for live streaming. Operator instructions are available, and training will be provided.



## DAILY PRAYERS FOR **VOCATIONS**


O Mary, St. Therese ever turned to you in love, telling you her desires in



TODAY'S GOSPEL: MATTHEW 15:21-28

Something to think about: The heart of God can be moved. Jesus had a particular mission to accomplish; the age of the universal Church was still waiting in the wings while He worked among the Jews. But the woman had what Christ's heart yearns for: love, faith, and humility. She was seeking a miracle not for herself, but for the sake of her beloved daughter and at her own expense (imagine how humiliating it would be to tag along behind a Jewish rabbi in public screaming to get His attention). And she believed in Christ. It is hard to imagine how she had come to believe in Him. Perhaps her initial faith was guite small (she calls him "Son of David," which could be a merely political title), but contact with Him increased it - at last she came, "kneeling at His feet," as to a Divinity. In any case, she knew that He could do it. She also knew that He would not do it because she deserved it, but simply because He cared. She was not angry with God for sending this trial; she did not come to Jesus furiously demanding justice. She accepted the trial and recognized that the miracle would be no less a gift than existence itself. This enabled her to take the rebuff and come right back with another petition to the Lord.

Love, faith, and humility: these are the secret ingredients for prayer that moves the heart of God - even a prayer as simple as, "Lord, help me." Dear God, Why don't I pray more? I don't deserve Your mercy and grace, but I do need them, and I know You want to give them. Help me to want the right things, to implore Your help for the people I love. I can't give them everything they need, but You can. Here me now as I pray for these people. Make me a channel of Your peace ....
