**PLEASE GET A SUBSTITUTE IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO BE AT YOUR SCHEDULED MASS AND IF YOU CANNOT, PLEASE CONTACT THE PARISH OFFICE.** All assigned ministers of Communion are to go up to the steps at the foot of the altar when the congregation starts saying or singing the "Lamb of God"

After the deacon drinks from the cup, the ministers of Communion should all bow (together). When you are ready to ascend from the bottom of the steps up to the altar platform, please climb the steps alongside the handrail. This means that the Communion Minister nearest to the handrail should be the first to climb the steps with the other Communion Ministers following him/her. This procedure should make it easy for any Communion Minister to use the handrail if he/she chooses to do so.

As you know, MB means you are the Minister of the Body of Christ and will be distributing hosts while the others will be Ministers of the Cup.

There will be some children and adults who will come forward with their hands held across their chest, the signal that they wish a blessing. A simple blessing such as "May the Lord bless you and always be with you" or "May the Lord Jesus Christ be present to you always" is given, with or without a sign of the cross.
