Dear St. Malachy Parishioners, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified and God has been glorified in Him" (John 13:31b). As we continue the Easter Season, we will continue to read the final

Easter homily of Pope Francis,

segments:

"We must look for (Jesus) without ceasing. Because if He has risen from the dead, then He is present everywhere, He dwells among us, He hides Himself and reveals Himself even today in the sisters and brothers we meet along the way, in the most ordinary and unpredictable situations of our lives. He is alive and is with us always, shedding the tears of those who suffer and adding to the beauty of life through the small acts of love carried out by each of us.

For this reason, our Easter faith, which opens us to the encounter with the risen Lord and prepares us to welcome Him into our lives, is anything but a complacent settling into some sort of "religious reassurance." On the contrary, Easter spurs us to action, to run like Mary Magdalene and the disciples; it invites us to have eyes that can "see beyond," to perceive Jesus, the one who lives, as the God who reveals Himself and makes Himself present even today, who speaks to us, goes before us, surprises us. Like Mary Magdalene, every day we can experience losing the Lord, but every day we can also run to look for Him again, with the certainty that He will allow Himself to be found and will fill us with the light of His resurrection."

May we run to look for Jesus, so that He can fill us with the light of His Resurrection.

Dear St. Malachy Families,

Based on feedback we have received regarding the future of 6th grade, questions of expanding St. Malachy School through 8th grade or beyond have resurfaced. As an initial response, I would like to take this opportunity to offer a summary to remind you of the findings from the Expansion Committee in 2021.

Summary of findings from the St. Malachy School Expansion Committee which began meeting in the Fall of 2021:

• Through the years, St. Malachy School has shown a low level of student retention through sixth grade, resulting in especially small sixth grade classes. While each individual student is certainly worth the effort, a higher enrollment is necessary to maintain a fiscally solvent school.

• The current rate of tuition generates revenue that is below the level recommended by the Office of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Peoria. Due to these factors, the school currently provides for significantly less than the appropriate portion of its own expenses.

 \diamond St. Malachy parish provides for a higher portion of the school expenses than is recommended by the diocese.

◊ A gradual increase in tuition will already be necessary in the coming years to sustain current operations.
 ◊ In addition to financial costs, we also already experience difficulty in retaining the number of faculty and staff needed even for a K-6 school.

◊ Capital improvements and construction would be necessary in order for an expansion to move forward, however, the costs of sustainability are far greater.

- Additional salaries, building materials, curriculum, supplies and technology would continue to result in ongoing expenses that are far greater than our current revenue would support.
- In order to meet these new expenses, the necessary increase in the rate of tuition would have to be so high that it could threaten our current enrollment and put even greater strain on our budget.

In short, we already have significant needs in order to continue to sustain the level of quality Catholic education at our school. This means we are not able to move forward with pursuing an expansion at this time. If the school experiences substantial enrollment growth in the years ahead and is able to reduce its dependence on parish subsidy, the question of expansion may be revisited at a future date by the pastor, school administration and the Education Commission.

This summary is being offered in order to clarify why the question of expansion is not being revisited at this time. But, I wish to also offer the clarification that the decision regarding 6th grade for the upcoming year is not motivated by finances. Let us remain united in love and prayer for our school.




