Pedaling Priests Visit St. Malachy School

Pedaling their bicycles right through the front doors of the school and into St. Malachy Hall, Fathers Adam Cesarek, Tom Otto and Michael Pica made their first stop on a five day, 350 mile trek across the length of the Diocese of Peoria on Monday, September 30th. The eager assembly of students, faculty, staff and parishioners cheered and welcomed them with enthusiasm and applause.



Prior to the pedaling priests' visit, St. Malachy students prepared by discussing vocations in their classes and completing a variety of activities. To help welcome the special quests, students and staff traced and decorated their handprints to wave at the assembly. Each student also colored or wrote a prayer on a strip of paper that was attached to the spokes of a bike as part of a display in the narthex. Kindergarteners colored a vocations booklet and fourth grade brainstormed to create an A-Z poster about vocations. In computer class, students created word art in the shape of bicycles crosses and hearts that adorned the lunch tables in the hall.



Their mission is not to raise money, but rather, is a prayer raiser for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Sharing their own personal experiences of God's call in their lives, these energetic young priests impressed upon the crowd that each person has been created by God the Father for a specific purpose. After he encouraged everyone to spend time in daily prayer to discern their own vocations, Father Cesarek led the students in a high intensity cheer, "Lord help me to want to be who You want me to be!" Inspired by the pedaling priests' contagious love for the Lord and desire that all people hear and obey God's plan for their lives, St. Malachy school has adopted this simple prayer as a part of our daily announcement and prayer to begin each and every school day.

Our Mom, Betty Laleman Vroman, was a woman of great faith. St. Malachy Church and school were such an important part of Mom's life. When Mom and our Dad, Fred, moved to Geneseo many years ago, it was decided their children would attend St Malachy School; and even though tuition was a sacrifice for them, they decided a Catholic education was worth the sacrifice. All seven of their children attended

St Malachy School.

After our Mom's passing we knew we wanted to use the money gifted by friends and family for Mom's memorial to be split between the church and school she loved so much. What we weren't sure of was how to use the money. Mary Beth noticed how many people who used the playground had nowhere to sit. She came up with the idea to have benches placed on the playground in Mom's honor. We had enough money for two benches. The benches we purchased are made of completely recycled materials, and are maintenance free.

We have family members with experience in pouring concrete, so it was decided we would do the site prep and bench installation on our own as a family. One day was spent digging out the dirt, making sure everything was level, and installing the forms.

The day we poured the concrete pads, instead of installing a plaque with Mom's name (she would've hated that!) we decided to have grandkids & greatgrandkids put their handprints in the concrete. Many hands made for light work. Afterward, we all gathered for a picnic in the shelter. It was a wonderful day!

Presently, there have been 3 generations of our family, twenty six descendants total, that have attended St. Malachy School with more to come in the future!
