Thinking Globally: St. Malachy Prays the World Mission Rosary

The World Mission Rosary was created by the late Archbishop Fulton Sheen in 1951; and the idea that inspired the design of this rosary is to "embrace the World in prayer!" This beautiful sentiment reflects our call to evangelize by the way that we live our lives—striving to openly share the love of Christ with the whole world.

It's a Dog's Life!

Tail wagging and wearing a blue vest that designates service dog status, Grogan visits St. Malachy 5th grade once a week for about 45 minutes with his owner, Mr. Bill Menendez. A therapy dog is an animal that visits schools, hospitals, nursing homes, etc. to provide attention, comfort and love. The Menendez's have previous experience working with service dogs. Their dog, Rock, worked for 14 years at Southwest and Millikin schools. Grogan has been a part of the Menendez family for about 3 years. He was a year old when their application was approved and they made the 9 hour trip to Concordia, KS to pick him up from CARES (Canine Assistance Rehabilitation Education Services) where he had been trained. Grogan currently works at the public library, St. Malachy, Southwest and GMS where he spends the entire school day twice a week. Aside from the most obvious benefit of providing companionship and love, Grogan's presence in schools often opens up communication and connection between students, faculty and staff.

Alumni Spotlight: Brother Nicholas Koenig, O.C.S.O

Answering God's call to the religious life as a Monk at New Melleray Abbey near Dubuque, Iowa, Br. Nicholas Koenig acknowledges that his Catholic education influenced his vocation. "It gave me my first formal introduction to the liturgical life and showed me that liturgy is naturally part of life. That seed would eventually grow into my monastic vocation."

The son of Kevin and Merva Koenig of St. Malachy Church, Br. Nicholas attended St. Malachy School from Kindergarten through sixth grade, and has fond memories of sitting on the playground reading during recess. Graduating from GHS in 2000, he went on to earn his Bachelors Degree in History and Political Science from Northern Illinois University in 2004.

Today he calls 25 Professed Brothers his family and dedicates all of his time and energy to knowing and serving the Lord through prayer, poverty, silence and manual labor within the community of the monastery.
