Kate (Anderson) Ristau, who attended St. Malachy School Kindergarten – 6th grade, is a folklorist and author. Ristau graduated from GHS in 1999. She visited St. Malachy School and spoke to the students sharing her passion for writing. Ristau studied Celtic mythology abroad, then, after volunteering with AmeriCorps, moved to Oregon. She completed her Masters Degree in folklore at the University of Oregon. Along the way, she learned to write her own stories—stories of magic and myth, fairies and folklore.

Ristau used to teach for the University of Oregon, but has put down her red pens to write full-time and has a literary agent representing her. She has written two series - Clockbreakers and Shadow Girl- along with a grammar primer.

Ristau describes her desire to write for young adults, "I'm a firm believer that kids should see themselves in the books they read, and also experience different perspectives. I write sci-fi / fantasy because I love creating worlds and expanding possibilities. In my books, kids discover the power of magic, possibility and belief. Plus, there are dragons!"
