### 2. Treasurer's Report Blake Patterson

We have spent quite a bit on technology, and will need to start budgeting.

Principal Francque stated that our technology will continue to amp up. Supporting the network infrastructure. Parents Club and the school budget pick that up.

The networks are separate for the school and church. Twin States takes care of the school. It was requested to have a detailed breakdown to see where that money is going. Prep will be the Thursday before with pan washing and Friday will be lasagna prep (noodle boiling, sauce making, prep the gym potentially day work). It was suggested to use disposable pans.
