

Liturgy Leanings for September 2020

The month of September is dedicated to Our Lady Of Sorrows, whose memorial the Church celebrates on September 15th. September falls during the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical color of green.



Feasts of September:

9/3 St. Gregory the Great - patron of the development of the Gregorian chant

9/4 First Friday of the month

9/6 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Times - Peacemaker and reconciler, how often do we see ourselves in that role? Yet this is the message and the work we have been given, the 'responsibility' we have for one another.

9/8 Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Only the births of Christ, Mary and John the Baptist are celebrated in our liturgical calendar. The Blessed Virgin Mary's assent to God's request gave humanity to the Messiah.

9/12 The Most Holy Name of Mary - The name of Mary is holy and sacred. When the angel Gabriel visited her, he called her by name and declared her "Blessed among women".

9/13 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Today's parable of the unmerciful servant illustrates the gospel point with a story of someone who refused to forgive, and his forgiveness was taken away.

9/14 Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross - Commemorates the finding of the true cross and dedication of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre on that site

9/15 Our Lady of Sorrows - Mary is certainly a model of suffering, as she witnessed her Son in His agony and death. She offered her suffering in union with His for the salvation of humankind

9/20 25th Sunday in Ordinary Times - Salvation is entirely God's gift; none of those who receive the gift have earned it.

9/21 Feast of St. Matthew - Apostle and Evangelist.

9/27 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time - The story of two sons who were told to go work in the vineyards. One said yes and did not go and the other said no and did go. "Which one did his father's will?"

9/29 Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, Raphael - Archangels. These are the only angels named in scripture and have traditionally held special roles in salvation history as agents of God who minister to human beings.

Pope Francis: Church Cannot Abandon Human Life

"Reason alone is sufficient to recognize the inviolable value of each single human life, but if we also look at the issue from the standpoint of faith, "every violation of the personal dignity of the human being cries out in vengeance to God and is an offence against the Creator of the individual" (John Paul II, *Christifideles Laici*, 37). Precisely because this involves the internal consistency of our message about the value of the human person, the Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question. I want to be completely honest in this regard. This is not something subject to alleged reforms or 'modernizations'"





Ezekiel 33:7-9 - God tells Ezekiel he will be held accountable for his task as a prophet.

Response Psalm 95: 8- "If today you hear His Voice, harden not your hearts."

Matthew 18:15-20 - Jesus shows how love can sometimes include confrontation.

Pope Francis reminds us: "Let us not forget the victims of the coronavirus," he said on August 23, following his Angelus address.
