PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

Please consider looking over next week's reading, Sunday October 18, 2020

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6 The prophet, Isaiah, who lived in Babylonia with the exiled Jews, tells us, in God's own Words, that He is the God, not only of the Jews, but of history and of the whole world.

Thessalonians 1:1-5b St. Paul praises his converts for their fidelity to God and to Christ His Son and tells them how they are ever in his prayers so that they would continue to be faithful to the call God had given them, a call proved by the many gifts of the Holy Spirit bestowed on them.

Matthew 22:15-21 God's plan for man on earth was that he should live in the society of his fellowmen. This government, this temporal power to rule and direct the human groups or societies or states, comes, therefore, from God for it is His will that such societies should exist. The answer of our Lord explicitly restates this fundamental norm of the divine natural law. "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's;" the state authorities have a right to the obedience and cooperation in all things that tend to the material welfare of the state, provided always the spiritual welfare of the members is not impeded by the rulers' demands.

OCTOBER RESPECT FOR LIFE MONTH

Human beings are made in the very image and likeness of God. It is for this reason that, although abortion is not the only evil that afflicts human society, the right to life is the very first of all our human rights, and the destruction of human life in the womb is an intrinsic evil. As is well recorded throughout the nearly twenty centuries of our religious history, Catholic believers have always opposed abortion and considered the act to be unjust and gravely sinful. Catholics may not in any way cooperate with this crime against humanity, and Catholic voters and politicians are not exempt from the shared obligation to protect innocent human life from conception until natural death. Despite the well-funded propaganda of the abortion industry, it is an obvious fact that abortion is horrifically painful to the child in the womb, and late term abortion is most especially cruel and barbaric. Organized abortion providers in America have also intentionally and disproportionately marketed their brutal business in poor neighborhoods and among racial and ethnic minorities. Catholics should therefore readily reach out to other believers and even non-believers to promote a culture of life and tirelessly oppose a culture of death.

For those in our Church, it is also certainly providential that October is not only Respect for Life Month but also the Month of the Holy Rosary. I urge all the faithful of the Diocese of Peoria not only to work tirelessly for the Gospel of Life, but also to ask the Blessed Mother, especially under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, who is always reverently depicted as being with child, to pray with us and for us in the face of terrible evil.



A Note From the Pastor ...


Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"O LORD, God of hosts, restore us; if Your face shines upon us, then we shall be saved" (Psalm 80, from last weekend's Lectionary). I want to thank Dcn. Robert for that bold and striking homily last weekend, challenging us all to embrace the humbling, yet profoundly simple reality that we are not God. It was further challenging to hear him apply this to the Right to Life. This is the most basic of those rights that our founding fathers in this nation called inalienable, meaning that they don't come from men and cannot be taken away by them. The right to life and the immeasurable dignity of each human person is given to us by God and must be respected at all costs. On the same weekend that we heard this message, we offered the annual Baby Bottles, to be taken home and filled with change or other monetary gifts to support life. There was some question over whether this endeavor would be one of many that would have to be set aside during the pandemic. The reason why we are not taking a break from this effort is simply because the needs do not go away. It is important for us to remember what the Pro-Life Movement is really about. Various media sources wish to present it as simply being "anti-abortion," as if any monetary gifts were simply used to fund lobbyists or gas money for "picketing" (another word that is often wrongly used, misrepresenting the purpose of people whose presence is one of prayerful and peaceful support to mothers in need, in hopes to offer them a real solution). In truth, the Pro-Life Movement is the Mercy of God at work in His people, reaching out to mothers, fathers and children in real need. It is found in the work of Crisis Pregnancy Centers providing both counsel and resources to mothers who feel frightened, alone and unsupported, in order to help them embrace and nurture the gift of life. It is found in the work of Post-Abortion Healing apostolates, breathing hope back into the hurting hearts of women and men, who have tragically believed that Christ and His Church could not love and forgive them after an abortion experience. It is the hard work of countless people in various other professions, working to defend the dignity of life, at all of its stages. Let us remember all of these efforts in our prayers this month, as we seek to allow the Mercy of God to fill us, that this gift may be shared with others.

PENNIES FOR LIFE 2020

For a number of years, the Peoria Diocesan Respect Life Board has conducted an annual "Pennies for Life" Collection. Funds collected support the diocesan-sponsored Family Resources Center in Peoria which

provides Pro-life/Pro-family resources to parishes, schools, and for religious education. Funds are also contributed to Pregnancy Resources in Moline and The Women's Choice Center in Bettendorf. Our Respect Life Board has traditionally asked that each parishioner, including children, contribute one penny for each year of his/her life in thanksgiving to God for the gift of life.

There are plastic baby bottles in the Narthex and we invite our parishioners to fill them with change and bring them back to church on or before October 25th. This approach enables us to support LIFE financially even more than when we were receiving a penny for each year of our parishioners' lives.
