Project Now is currently helping clients apply for energy assistance through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). LIHEAP provides federally funded assistance in managing costs associated with: Home energy bills, energy crises, weatherization and energy-related minor home repairs.

Many Geneseo and Atkinson residents receive clothing and household items from the Food Pantry to help them stay within their budget. The Food Pantry is currently most in need of winter coats of all sizes and girls clothing.

PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD Readings for Sunday November 1, 2020

Revelation: 7:2-4, 9-14 "After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could count, from every nation and *all* tribes and peoples and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, and palm branches *were* in their hands;"

1 John 3:1-3 "See how great a love the Father has bestowed on us, that we would be called children of God; and *such* we are."

Matthew 5:1-12a "When Jesus saw the crowds, He went up on the mountain; and after He sat down, His disciples came to Him. He opened His mouth and *began* to teach them, saying, Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. "Blessed are the <code>lgentle</code>, for they shall inherit the earth.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are you when *people* insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. ¹² Rejoice and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great; for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

Liturgy Leanings for November, 2020

November--Month of All Souls; The season of Ordinary Time concludes on November 22 with the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ,



King of the Universe." The last Sunday of November, the 29th, is the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the Cycle B readings and a new liturgical year. The color for the Sundays of Ordinary Time is green, while violet is the color for the four Sundays of the season of Advent. The first week of November is "National Vocation Awareness Week."

Saints whose memorials are observed during November:

11/1—(Sunday) All Saints' Day, a Holy Day of Obligation: May we be inspired to imitate the lives of those who are canonized saints, as well as those whom we have known who we believe are living forever in heaven with God

11/2—All Souls' Day: A commemoration of all the Faithful Departed; we especially think of those who have died since last All Souls' Day

11/3—Saint Malachy O'More, the patron saint of our parish; Bishop of Armagh, Ireland, 1129-1148; canonized in 1190 by Pope Clement III; also—Saint Martin de Porres: patron saint of racial justice, born in Lima, Peru, became a Dominican brother

11/4—Saint Charles Borromeo: as a Cardinal of the Church, he participated in the Council of Trent, supported clerical codes of conduct and seminary reform

11/9—Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome in 324; this is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the pope (NOT Saint Peter's!); the "mother church" of all churches in the world

11/11—Saint Martin of Tours: a Roman soldier who converted to Christianity, became the Bishop of Tours

11/13—Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini: Italian immigrant to New York; first U.S. citizen canonized, on July 7, 1846, by Pope Pius XII; National Shrine in Chicago

11/16—Saint Margaret of Scotland: Queen of Scotland, mother of eight children, dedicated to prayer, good works, restoring monasteries

11/17—Saint Elizabeth of Hungary: Queen of Hungary, special care for poor, feeding the hungry, and nursing the sick

11/18—Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne: came to Missouri to educate Native Americans and the poor of St. Louis; a member of the Society of the Sacred Heart, she and the sisters established orphanages and schools across this country; canonized July 3, 1988 by Pope John Paul II, Shrine in St. Charles, Mo

11/24—Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions: Vietnamese priest and 117 companions who died practicing the Catholic faith in Vietnam between the 16th and 17th centuries

11/30—Saint Andrew, Apostle: the first of the Twelve to meet Jesus

A Note From the Pastor ...

"I love You, Lord, my strength." The Lord is indeed our strength and our salvation and has shown us His goodness and faithfulness time and time again. We have much to be thankful for and so much reason to allow hope to take precedence over fear in our hearts. It is with this confidence and gratitude that we enter into an exciting and meaningful moment in the life of our parish: The Saint Malachy Novena. The novena, as you may know, is simply nine days of prayer leading up to a feast day or other occasion. If we are praying our novena, that must mean our feast day is coming up! Indeed, the Feast of Saint Malachy is November 3rd. This year, it falls on a Tuesday and happens to also be election day. For this reason, we will begin praying the Saint Malachy Novena this weekend (Sunday, October 25th) with three intentions: For Our Parish, Our Nation, and Our World. We pray for our parish, asking for a time of renewal as we prepare for our feast day. We pray for our nation, praying for the upcoming election. And we pray for our world, in this time of pandemic. We bring these three primary petitions to Our Lord with great confidence and passionate hope. What form will the novena take, you ask? I have compiled a set of readings and prayers, based on the Common of Pastors and of Holy Men from the church's Liturgy of the Hours. Copies will be made available on the parish website and sent out to those on our email list (if you would like help getting your hands on a copy, please reach out to the parish office). And while these prayers can be prayed at any time, there will be a daily call to prayer, in which parishioners are warmly invited to participate either in person or from home (we are working on seeing how many days we can livestream this). The daily call to prayer will consist of 30 minutes of Eucharistic Adoration ("Holy Half-Hour") in the Church at NOON every day for all nine days (Sunday, October 25th - Monday, November 2nd). The next day, when we celebrate the feast day itself, instead of Eucharistic Adoration at noon, we will have a Special Noon Mass, at which I will make my Oath of Fidelity and Profession of Faith, in the presence of the local vicar, Father Engelbrecht (this process is considered a formal "installation" as pastor of the parish). I look forward to this important occasion with you all. Let us know that our patron, Saint Malachy, prays with & for us, as we join together in prayer for our parish, for our nation, & for our world.


