Readings for Sunday, Nov 29th, FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT 2020

The readings on First Sunday of Advent remind us to be aware of our need for Christ who strengthens us until the end.

In the First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah (63:16-19; 64:2-7), we hear the prophet lamenting a prayer of frustration directed to God.

The Responsorial Psalm (80:2-19) is a beautiful prayer that continues the same theme of calling upon God to come and lead us to salvation.

The Second Reading is from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (1:3-9). Here, Paul is giving thanks for the blessings that God has given His people through Jesus Christ. This is the fulfillment of Isaiah's prayer. Christ did come to save His people.

The Gospel Reading is from Mark (13:33-37). In these few words, we have a powerful statement from Jesus Christ Himself. It is directed to everyone, but not everyone need be worried. Those who are walking in the footsteps of Christ will be ready and alert when He comes for them; but those who have lagged behind, this meeting could be a time of great despair.




Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

“Just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life.” These words of Saint Paul point us to the mystery of new life, which we received on the day of our baptism. Especially for the many of us who were baptized as infants, the gift of our baptism can seem so very far away. Yet, every time that we pray the Our Father, we recall our identity as children of God by the gift of that sacrament. Every time we pray the Creed, we take into our hands the very promises made at our baptism and make them our own. Perhaps we don’t dip our hands into holy water currently, due to the pandemic, but, we can still make use of Holy Water in different ways (you are welcome to fill a bottle from the can in the chapel; just don’t dip your hands inside). These reminders can be little moments of renewal of this gift. But we may sometimes forget, or even worse yet avoid, the truer and more complete restoration to the grace of our baptism; namely the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When we think that the sacrament is all about our sins, which we don’t like to think about (even though we need to), we are missing the deeper secret of the sacrament: the gift of being restored to the grace of our baptism. We should picture the scene at Our Lord’s baptism, in which the heavens opened and the Father embraced Him as His beloved Son, because we are truly brought back to the moment when the Father embraced us as His beloved children in Christ, as we became members of His Body at our baptism. If sorrow for sin doesn’t drive us toward the sacrament, then a deeper appreciation of the gift of baptism certainly should. As we reach the end of another Church Year, with this weekend’s celebration of Christ the King, it is good to consider: ‘How long has it been since my last confession?’ If it has been more than a year, we should most definitely make plans to receive the sacrament without delay. And we should never be afraid to be welcomed home to the sacrament. But, as so many Catholics have discovered, if we are limiting ourselves to that annual confession (which is the minimum for any practicing Catholic), we are missing out on the great graces of growth and healing that come from making it a more regular part of our life throughout the year. I recommend approaching the end of the Church Year the way we approach the end of a calendar year: make some resolutions. Does anything need to change? Where do I need to grow? What do I want to do better, as I strive to live a morally upright and selfless life of service to God and my neighbor?

As we embrace these challenges made to ourselves with confidence and enthusiasm, it is essential that our efforts be fortified by the restoration to the grace of baptism, which we receive when we humble ourselves by making a good confession. As we approach Advent, which is one of the two penitential seasons of the year, we will offer even more opportunities to celebrate this beautiful sacrament. Beginning on Monday, November 30th through December 23rd, there will be a special "Advent Confession time" added from 12-12:30 on Monday-Thursday. Also, on the weekend of December 12-13, there will be a priest in the confessional after each of the weekend Masses. Please join me in praying that as many of our parishioners as possible can celebrate the birth of Our Lord, tasting the joy of having been recently restored to the grace of their baptism.

Schedule Change for Thanksgiving: Ironically, after spending the whole letter promoting Reconciliation, we are cancelling one of the times this week, but for the very understandable reason of Thanksgiving. There will **NOT** be 5pm Confessions or 4:30 Holy Hour this Thursday, as the Mass is moved to 9 AM.




