

READINGS FOR DEC. 20, 2020 - 4th SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The first reading is taken from <u>2 Samuel 7:1-5; 8-11;16</u> and refers to when David was anointed king in Hebron by all the tribes of Israel and Judah and his first step was to capture Jerusalem from the Jebusites and make it the political capital of his kingdom.

The second reading is from the <u>Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 26:25-27</u> where he introduces himself to the Christians in Rome and he gives an incomplete synthesis of his theology.

His words remind us to give glory to God this Christmas and always, for the marvelous things He has done for us.

The Gospel is from <u>Luke 1:26-38</u>. At the moment our Lady said: "be it done to me according to Thy Word" the most stupendous event that ever happened, or ever could happen on earth, took place on this planet of ours. The Son of God took on human nature in the womb of the Blessed Virgin.

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

Happy Gaudete Sunday!



Friends, how was your time with Jesus in prayer this week? Remember, prayer is the most important form of preparation for Christmas. Nothing else can take its place. Nothing else is more important. Also, nothing else fills our hearts with the kind of hope and peace that enable us to take up the call of this Third Sunday of Advent to REJOICE (Gaudete)! Like I said last weekend in this weekly bulletin letter, if we ask that question at the end of a week (or of a day) and find that we must answer honestly that we have failed to make time to be with the Lord in prayer this past week, we do not become discouraged, but simply resolve to make time to be with Him today, tomorrow and the next day!

Remember the words I shared with you at the start of Advent, from St. Bernard (biographer and friend of Saint Malachy), regarding the way in which Christ comes to be with us, in our daily lives: "He comes in spirit and in power... Listen to what our Lord himself says: If anyone loves Me, he will keep My Word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him." There is another passage of Scripture which reads: "He who fears God will do good," but something further has been said about the one who loves, that is, that he will keep God's Word. Where is God's Word to be kept? Obviously in the heart, as the prophet says: "I have hidden Your Words in my heart, so that I may not sin against You." Keep God's Word in this way. Let it enter into your very being, let it take possession of your desires and your whole way of life. Feed on goodness, and your soul will delight in its richness. Remember to eat your bread, or your heart will wither away. Fill your soul with richness and strength... He is our rest and consolation." In the latter days of Advent, let us remember that it is not too late to find rest and consolation in the Lord and so find the JOY that comes with the mystery of God With Us.

Please note: In order to focus on preparing my body, mind and soul for Christmas, beginning on Wednesday, December 16th, I will discontinue non-sacramental in-person appointments and also refrain from greeting in the narthex. There will be no changes to the sacramental schedule and I will still be available by phone and email.
