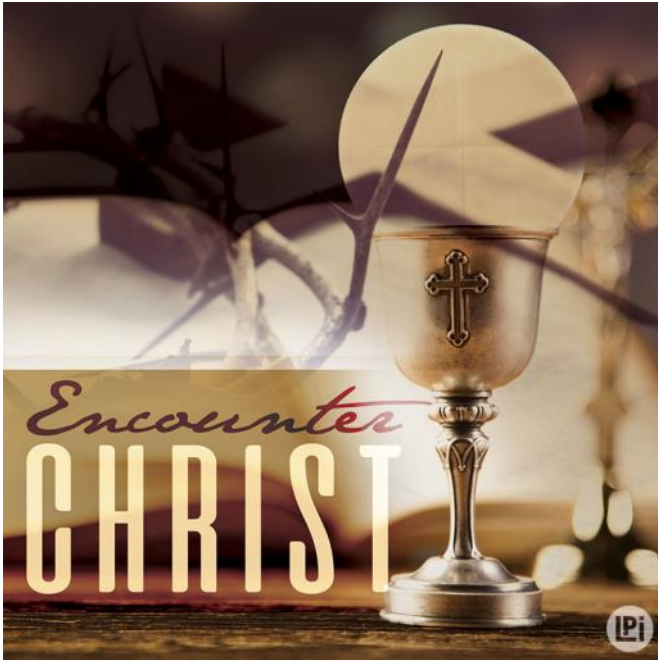

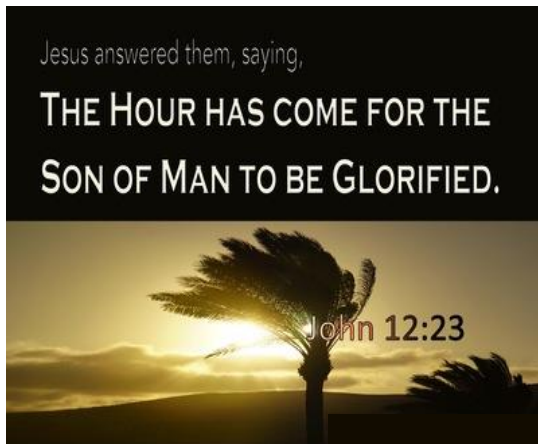

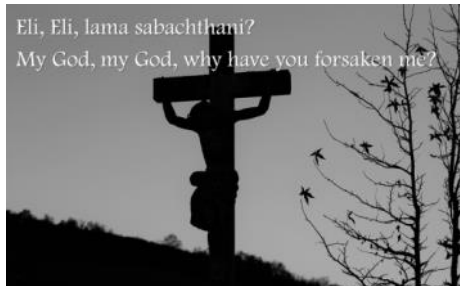

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,



*“When the days were completed for their purification... (Mary and Joseph) took Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord...” (Luke 2:22).* . Last weekend, I focused on how this time of purification is meant to bring about ongoing and deepening conversion of heart. In this ongoing personal conversion, the fires of purification reignite the light that we are meant to carry into the darkness of the world around us. Now, in this final weekend before we will be beginning Holy Week, it is time to acknowledge that darkness in the world around us and our corresponding call to pray for conversions within the world. When Saint Paul addresses this need for prayer to his friend and pupil Timothy, he says: *“First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity. This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth. For there is one God. There is also one mediator between God and the human race, Christ Jesus, himself human, who gave himself as ransom for all (1 Tim 2:1-6).”* This prayer for conversions, which is to be coupled with a fearless and unwavering witness to the Truth of the Gospel in word and in deed, is meant to include, in particular, prayers for those entrusted with civic leadership, whose actions and decisions greatly impact all of our lives. This is the will of God, as revealed in Sacred Scripture. It is to be a part of all of our lives that we pursue the ongoing conversion of our leaders, especially where they stand opposed to the will of God and to the freedom of the Church. We do this by whatever civic action we can take in making our voice heard, as well by our prayers. We must acknowledge that this includes prayers for conversion of heart for our president, who professes Catholicism, yet persistently stands opposed to the will of God and the freedom of the Church, in his political activity. As Catholics, this is not something we can support or afford to be complacent about. In a letter responding to President Biden’s inauguration, the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, addressed these matters. After pledging his prayers for the president, Archbishop Gomez acknowledged that the bishops always strive to work cooperatively with every administration, and always experience areas of agreement, as well as areas of opposition. He also went on to acknowledge President Biden’s Catholic faith, saying that his, “piety and personal story, his moving witness to how his faith has brought him solace in times of darkness and tragedy, his longstanding commitment to the Gospel’s priority for the poor - all of this I find hopeful and inspiring.” Yet, he goes on to acknowledge what we cannot be silent about: “I must point out that our new President has pledged to pursue certain policies that would advance moral evils and threaten human life and dignity, most seriously in the areas of abortion, contraception, marriage, and gender. Of deep concern is the liberty of the Church and the freedom of believers to live according to their consciences. Our commitments on issues of human sexuality and the family, as with our commitments in every other area - such as abolishing the death penalty or seeking a health care system and economy that truly serves the human person - are guided by Christ’s great commandment to love and to stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters, especially the most vulnerable. For the nation’s bishops, the continued injustice of abortion remains the “preeminent priority.” Preeminent does not mean “only.” We have deep concerns about many threats to human life and dignity in our society. But as Pope Francis teaches, we cannot stay silent when nearly a million unborn lives are being cast aside in our country year after year through abortion.”

These matters are truly not “political” issues, but are borne of a desire to see the will of God, whose image is stamped upon every human person from the moment of conception, honored and respected. As Saint Paul stated, “(God) *wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth. For there is one God. There is also one mediator between God and the human race, Christ Jesus, himself human, who gave himself as ransom for all.*” His Truth must transform our land and we must pray that, while we have a president who professes belief in Christ and His Church, that this man’s heart would be changed to be in accord with His Truth. We neither judge President Biden, nor doubt the sincerity of his faith, but simply acknowledge that conversion is an on going process and that Our Lord’s call to “Repent,” echoes through our lives, as we continually must strive to humble ourselves and conform our hearts to His will. So, what shall we pray for? Regardless, I propose we join Archbishop Gomez in, “praying that God grant him wisdom and courage to lead this great nation and that God help him to meet the tests of these times, to heal the wounds caused by this pandemic, to ease our intense political and cultural divisions, and to bring people together with renewed dedication to America’s founding purposes, to be one nation under God committed to liberty and equality for all.” Furthermore, we also pray in hope that, “Rather than impose further expansions of abortion and contraception, as he has promised, ... that the new President and his administration will work with the Church and others of good will. My hope is that we can begin a dialogue to address the complicated cultural and economic factors that are driving abortion and discouraging families. My hope, too, is that we can work together to finally put in place a coherent family policy in this country, one that acknowledges the crucial importance of strong marriages and parenting to the well-being of children and the stability of communities. If the President, with full respect for the Church’s religious freedom, were to engage in this conversation, it would go a long way toward restoring the civil balance and healing our country’s needs.” Finally, we “entrust all our hopes and anxieties in this new moment to the tender heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mother of Christ and the patroness of this exceptional nation. May she guide us in the ways of peace and obtain for us wisdom and the grace of a true patriotism and love of country.” When we approach the Cross of Christ in Holy Week, let us hope in the promise of salvation and mercy pouring from His cross.

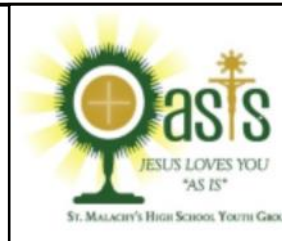
