



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,



"When His parents saw Him, they were astonished and His mother said... 'Your father and I have been looking for You with anxiety." (Luke 2:48). These words represent a moment in which Good Saint Joseph, along with Our Blessed Mother, stood in the midst of a subtle, yet profound prefiguration of the Resurrection of Our Lord. As we continue through the Easter Season in this month of April, it is good that we allow this to be our "theme verse" for this month of the Year of Joseph, so that we can keep before us this memory of the moment in which these holy parents suffered three days of anxiety and loss, only to be reunited with the Lord on the third day. As we live in the hope and newness of being reunited with Christ in His glorious Resurrection, after entering into His Passion in Holy Week, may Good Saint Joseph, often called "Foster-father of the Son of God" (more on that another time, but this will be the title we'll focus on in the month of April), pray for us. With the help of Joseph's prayers, may we keep seeking the Risen Christ, like he and Mary diligently and even anxiously sought Him for those three days, because He is seeking us. The Risen Christ truly wants to meet us personally. Remember, that the Easter Octave does not conclude until we read the story, next weekend, of an Apostle (Saint Thomas) who had not yet personally encountered the Risen Christ. That holy apostle would want us to learn from his mistake and not wait until this encounter before we choose to believe and trust the Lord. but he would also want us to notice the importance of our need to personally meet the Risen Christ. Take some time for prayer, in the midst of everything else that these days hold, to be with the Lord. Allow Him to speak to your heart and speak to Him from yours. Like Mary and Joseph, speak to Him of the anxiety that has been on your heart as you have sought Him and had difficulty finding Him. Then, notice that He is pointing you toward the Father - just as He did for Mary and Joseph on the third day (Did you not know I must be in My Father's house?) AND as He did for Mary Magdalene on a different third day (I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God). Ask Jesus to take you to the Father's Heart, that you may rediscover His Love for you.

As Jesus comes forth from the tomb... I will be going forth from Geneseo. But, don't worry, I'll be back by the end of the week. As I told the children, their spring break happens to be my busiest week of the year, so I am taking my own spring break the next week. The first three days, I will be away on a short vacation with some priest friends, while the last couple of days, I will be relaxing in Geneseo. Thus, I will still offer the Thursday evening Holy Hour, Confessions and Mass. However, this will be the

ONLY Confession time that week. I am grateful to our good deacons for providing Communion Services during the regular Mass times on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, as well as to Fr. Duane Jack for celebrating the "Easter Wednesday" Mass for our school children. My official return will be for the 3:30 Confessions on Saturday.

Have a most happy, blessed and safe beginning to this Glorious Easter Season!



LITURGY LEANINGS APRIL 2021

The month of April is filled with Feast Days, Celebrations and Observances
The month of April is dedicated to the Holy Spirit...
The Holy Spirit is one of the Persons of the Holy Trinity.
"With the Father and the Son, He is worshiped and glorified."



Thursday, April 1st is the beginning of The Triduum: The three days before Easter that recognize the great events of salvation worked by Christ.

The Easter Triduum is the Center of Christian Faith

Holy Thursday commemorates "The Last Supper" when Jesus shared His last meal with His Apostles.

After the meal Jesus showed a powerful example of serving others by getting down to the dirt to wash the Apostles feet. Holy Thursday is sometimes referred to as Maundy Thursday; meaning "a new mandate" "Love one another as I have loved you" John 13:34.

At the end of Mass, the Sanctuary is stripped clean in preparation for Good Friday.

Good Friday is a somber remembrance of Jesus crucifixion and death on the cross. The altar remains stripped of ornamentation from the Holy Thursday and the tabernacle left open and empty. Good Friday is not a Mass; Concentration prayers are omitted and Holy Communion that is given out has been consecrated on Holy Thursday.

Easter Vigil on Saturday begins in darkness followed by lighting of the Paschal candle that reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world who has conquered all darkness and death. The Paschal candle will remain in the church throughout the year as a sign of Christ death and resurrection.

Veneration of the Cross is a time for the faithful to ponder the enormity of Christ's sacrifice.

The Paschal candle is later used in baptisms and funerals.

Easter Sunday is the day we celebrate Christ's resurrection. It is the single most important feast day of the Church. Easters on this earth will lead us to that blessed day which Christ has promised that He will come again with glory to take us with Him into the kingdom of His Father.

He is Risen! Alleluia Alleluia!

Divine Mercy Sunday was designated by Pope John Paul II in the year 2000 to be observed on the Sunday after Easter to focus on the sacrifice of Jesus and that we encounter His mercy and His forgiveness of our sins.

Easter Season continues until the seventh Sunday after Easter Sunday which is Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles

Bits and Pieces:

Easter Sunday falls on the Sunday after the full moon following March 21st.

Easter lilies represent the beauty and glory of Christ.

Easter baskets filled with jellybeans and candy were originally a way to celebrate the end of Lenten penance.

Easter eggs became a symbol of the rock sealing the tomb out of which Our Lord gloriously emerged to the new life of His Resurrection.
