Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"When His parents saw Him, they were astonished and His mother said... 'Your father and I have been looking for you with anxiety." (Luke 2:48). St. Joseph, Foster-father of the Son of God, pray for us! Before we conclude the month of April, I would like to reflect on our chosen title for Saint Joseph for this month. Perhaps some of you may have guessed that there was a bit of irony in the choice of this title to accompany Luke 2:48. Naturally, it was chosen because the fatherhood of Saint Joseph is quite important to this verse. With a fatherly heart, filled with concern for his Son, Joseph was in solidarity with his wife, as they sought Jesus together with anxiety. However, when you look at the words used in the Scriptures themselves here, the irony might quickly become apparent. You may recall my saying back when I introduced the Year of Saint Joseph, that I have always felt that this title "foster-father" seems like "short change" which perhaps doesn't adequately do justice to the nature of Joseph's fatherhood. As I said in that introductory homily, adoptive fathers tend to understand this point readily because they are living it: just because one is not the biological father does not mean he cannot be a true father to the child. This bit taken from human experience can make the case clearly enough. But, perhaps it can be made even more simply by opening to Luke 2:48. If the Scriptures themselves do not hesitate to call Joseph the "father" of Our Lord, why should we! One might think the word "father" is chosen here, simply as a way of keeping up the charade. But, the fatherhood of Saint Joseph is NOT simply a charade! He truly loved and cared for the Lord with a genuinely fatherly heart. Neither Our Lord nor the Immaculately Conceived Virgin Mary were either deceiving or being deceived when they treated Joseph as a true father to Jesus, or even addressed him that way. The same Jesus, who later stirred up the ire of the Sanhedrin by referring to God Almighty as His Father, looked to Joseph and would have addressed him as father, or papa or even daddy. And when He did so, He meant it. Likewise, when the Blessed Virgin Mary referred to him as "your father" she meant it. His fatherhood is real, even though it is not biological! I have also heard it pointed out, by Christopher West in his teaching on John Paul II's Theology of the Body, that "the mission of all authentic human fatherhood is to point to God the Father... so, by the very fact that Joseph is not the (biological) father, Joseph more perfectly points to Who the real father is" (roughly quoted, I heard it many years ago and it's always stuck with me). Notice, God the Father is not the biological father there simply is not one. But, God the Father is certainly the Father of Jesus in the absolute truest sense of the word. Still, the fatherhood of Joseph can rightly be described as authentic human fatherhood

Alas, this title cannot be found in the Litany of Saint Joseph or used often in sacred tradition. Perhaps that will change one day. Until then, when I repeat the title "Foster-father of the Son of God," taken from the Litany of Saint Joseph, what I have in mind is "Authentic Human Father to the Son of God." May we continue to wonder at this incredible gift and responsibility, given to Good Saint Joseph, of being a father to the Son of God! May this mystery empower us to come to know him as a true father in the faith to us, as well.

**THANK YOU:** As we continue our Novena for Saint Joseph the Worker, which concludes our Parish Mission, I want to thank everyone who participated in any way. In particular, I am grateful to our speakers, our musicians each night, and the parishioners who submitted video testimonies for the novena.

Also, I would like to acknowledge a few people who worked hard behind the scenes: Elizabeth Hulsbrink, who recruited and coordinated the musicians for each night, Jennifer Ulam, who coordinated all of the video testimonies for the novena, Ali Rapps, who made the beautiful poster for the narthex, and Sheila Henson and Darci Dietrich, who collaborated in the planning of the social following Mass on Thursday. #### Laying down our lives

The Good Shepherd lays down His life for His sheep. This theme is found also in the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) On the road from Jerusalem to Jericho, a man fell in with robbers. A priest and a Levite came by, but did not stop to help.

Despite their knowledge of the Law and Prophets, they walked right by. Why?

One of the reasons may be that they were afraid. The road from Jerusalem to Jericho is a dangerous road. Because of its numerous steep curves, it lends itself to attacks by robbers who can easily hide not too far from their victims. Perhaps the priests and Levites who passed by that man asked themselves, "If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me? Maybe the robbers who attacked him are still here. Maybe they're hiding just around the bend. This is a dangerous road. I better keep going."

Sometimes we ask the same question. If, for example, I speak up too loudly about the victims of abortion, what will happen to me? Will I face persecution, will I encounter opposition, will I lose popularity if I get involved in a cause like this?

And then the Good Samaritan came along, and he reversed the question. He didn't ask, "If I help this man, what will happen to me?" The Good Samaritan asked, "If I do not help this man, what will happen to him?" And that's the question for us. If I do not address this evil, what will happen to the unborn? If I do not get involved, what will happen to those who are vulnerable, to those who are marginalized in our society, to those who are oppressed, to those who have no one to speak for them?



#### LITURGY LEANINGS - MAY 2021

The month of May is dedicated to the **Blessed Virgin Mary**. The first 23 days fall within the season of **Easter**, which is represented by the color white-the color of light, and a symbol of joy, purity, and innocence. The remainder of the month beginning after Pentecost returns to **Ordinary Time** which is represented by the color of green and is the symbol of sprouting seed and arouses the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven and our resurrection.

**Ascension of the Lord** recognizes the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven forty days after Easter and this year is observed on Thursday, May 13<sup>th</sup>. It is often celebrated on the Sunday after and is a **Holy Day of Obligation** 

**Pentecost Sunday** falls on May 23rd and is the birthday of the Church and the recognizes the descent of the **Holy Spirit**. This Christian holiday commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the Apostles on the fiftieth day after the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Apostles began to speak in many languages and received other spiritual gifts.



**Trinity Sunday-**May 30<sup>th</sup>, is the first Sunday after Pentecost to honor and give emphasis to the Trinity (the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit)

### FEAST DAYS

Pope Francis declared the entire year 2021, the year of St. Joseph. **May 1**<sup>st</sup> **is a Feast Day for St. Joseph the Worker**. He is the patron saint of carpenters and fathers. St. Joseph is honored and remembered for his care and protection given to Mary and Jesus.

The entire month of every year is devoted to Mary, mother of Jesus. Several Feast Days for the Blessed Virgin Mary are observed during May. May 13<sup>th</sup> is Our Lady of Fatima; May 24th honors Mary, Mother of the Church and May 31st is The Visitation which commemorates the visit of Mary to her Cousin Elizabeth, mother of John the Baptist.

In our farming community we must not overlook the **Feast of St Isidore the Farmer**. He was a Spanish farmworker and proclaimed for his pity towards the poor and animals. His death on **May 15th**,1130 coincides with the date of his annual Feast Day.

During May, three apostles are recognized with Feast Days. **On May 3<sup>rd</sup> St Phillip and James share their Feast Day**. History through the gospels tells of their fervent testimony to Jesus' resurrection and how they helped establish the church.

May 14th is the Feast Day of the apostle St. Matthias., According to the Acts of the Apostles, he was chosen by the apostles to replace Judas Iscariot following the latter's betrayal of Jesus and his subsequent death.

We, the members of Christ's Mystical Body, are the present-day disciples sent by the Holy Spirit to bring Christ to the world. May we go forth as did Mary and the Apostles to proclaim the greatness of the Lord Who has done great things for us-for His mercy endures forever.


