

A Note From the Pastor

"Joseph... took his wife into his home." (Matthew 1:24b). Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Mother of God, Chaste Guardian of the Virgin, pray for us! As we continue the Month of Mary ends, let's talk about the titles Spouse of the Mother of God and Chaste Guardian of the Virgin. To all of the husbands out there, you know how you can have moments where you come to know and see in a fuller way just what an incredible woman you married and you think, "Wow, and I thought I loved her before?!" Nod your head and say yes, you'll be glad you did. Well, can you imagine finding out that your wife was destined to become the Mother of God?! And yet, when we consider all of what this would entail for him, we see that not only did he hit the jackpot, but he also would have a great honor and dignity and also a great responsibility placed upon himself. Indeed, the Spouse of the Mother of God would also necessarily be the Chaste Guardian of the Virgin. The first part of that second title, namely the word "chaste," shouldn't be a surprise, if we understand the word properly. Sometimes we fall into the trap of limiting our understanding of chastity to merely sexual abstinence outside of marriage. All people are called to be chaste, in all vocations and stages in life, because chastity is the virtue of using God's gift of sexuality according to His design, which calls married couples to always honor the call to selfless love and openness to life. So, the call to chastity as a husband is not unique to Joseph, since it is extended to all. The second part of the title is a bit more surprising: chaste guardian of the virgin. The uniqueness of the marriage of Joseph and Mary is found in that they would preserve virginity within marriage. It is an interesting question of whether this was a surprise to Joseph or not, upon learning of the virginal conception of Christ. There is a misunderstanding which suggests that virginal marriages were totally unheard of in ancient Israel. In fact, while it was certainly uncommon, it had a place within God's plan and apparently within the experience of God's people, as the Book of Numbers even contains specific guidelines regarding such a case (Numbers 30). There is both Scriptural and

historical evidence which suggests that the marriage of Mary and Joseph may indeed have been such a case of the wife having made such a vow to God and the husband agreeing to honor and thus enter into this vow with her. These questions are, of course, speculative and their exact answers are uncertain, but even the possibility helps to shed light upon a portrait of Saint Joseph as a man who embraced Mary's call to consecrate herself to the Lord as a virgin and even to share in that consecration by the mutual commitment that would obviously be needed from both of them. Saint Joseph models the chaste, self-giving, and sacrificial love of a husband for his wife. May he intercede for all of our husbands and

fathers and their families.



UPDATE FROM FR. GIFFORD ABOUT THE NEXT STEPS IN OUR CHURCH RE-OPENING

Dear Saint Malachy Parishioners,

As we continue the gradual process of reopening of our parish, which began last summer, we have much to be thankful for and hopeful about in the present moment. Nonetheless, we intend to continue to prioritize the safety of our parishioners and to remain cautious and considerate of all, in this trying time in which serious concerns for public health continue to be present in our society. With this in mind, after consultation with our Parish Reopening Committee, I would like to share some key steps that will be taken to update our current guidelines, in light of the most recent guidance from CDC, as well as the current status of statewide regulations.

Hymnals and Missalettes: Our hymnals and missalettes will remain available for use on the carts and stands in the baptistry and narthex. The hymnals will no longer be isolated in quarantine between weekend Masses and thus will no longer require the assistance of volunteers. Parishioners and guests at Mass are free to take their own hymnals, but are asked to return them to the carts after Mass, rather than leaving them in their pews, out of respect for the next person to use their pew, who may prefer not to have it with them. Similarly, Missalettes should be returned after Mass, rather than taken home. This new policy will be effective immediately.

The following policies will take effect May 29, 2021:

Pew Cleaning: The cleaning and sanitizing of pews between Masses will become optional, rather than being required. With this information, individuals may choose to sanitize their pew on the way into Mass, rather than on the way out, as they prefer.

Masks and Social Distancing: The most recent guidance from the CDC indicates that it is now safe for many individuals to choose not to wear masks or practice social distancing, while others are still being asked to continue these practices. State guidelines have been adjusted accordingly. *It is recommended that all parishioners and guests follow the guidance of the CDC, in order to make a responsible decision in order to promote one's own safety and the safety of all. These developments will evoke a variety of different reactions in different people and the commitment to being respectful of one another amidst these differences will be needed from every member of our parish family. The following specific guidelines are designed to attempt to preserve an environment in which our parishioners feel safe and able to continue to enter into worship, while also providing a less restricted environment, now that it is safe to begin taking some of these steps:*

- •The 8:15 Mass will continue to require mask wearing and social distancing for all present in all parts of the building for the entirety of their time within the building.
- •At all remaining Masses, one half of the seating within the main Church and the chapel (Window Side) will require masks and social distancing, while both will be optional in the other half (Choir side).
- •At all Masses, those seated in the narthex are asked to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks.
- •In order to preserve safe interactions between masked and unmasked individuals, at ALL Masses, masks should be worn on the way to and from your seat, on the way to receive Holy Communion, and by Greeters, Ushers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion while performing their duties.

EMMAUS DAYS 2021

Registration is now open for Emmaus Days, a summer program for young men and boys sponsored by the Diocese of Peoria.

After major adaptations last year because of the pandemic

- including a series of online videos and small, one-day regional gatherings - the program returns to the familiar in-person format of four, multi-day sessions for age groups ranging from junior high to college age and young adult.

That opportunity to be together is vital, according to Father Chase Hilgenbrinck of the diocesan Office of Vocations.

"Emmaus Days is an experience," Father Hilgenbrinck told The Catholic Post. "It's an experience of being in community with other faithful men who desire to have fun in a virtuous, faith-based setting."

TWO SITES, FOUR SESSIONS

Sessions I and II, both in June, will take place at St. John's Catholic Newman Center in Champaign.

Sessions III and IV, both in July, will be hosted by Peoria Notre Dame High School. Here is the schedule:

- · Session I June 11-14, for college age and young adults.
- \cdot Session II June 25-28, for high school juniors and seniors
- \cdot Session III July 18-21, for high school freshmen and sophomores, and
- · Session IV July 21-23, for seventh- and eighth-graders.

All sessions are led by seminarians and priests and include opportunities to pray and learn as well as lighthearted activities. The final day includes a Mass with Bishop Daniel R. Jenky, CSC, and Coadjutor Bishop Louis Tylka, as well as an opportunity for participants and their parents to meet and ask questions of the bishops.

This year's theme, "More than Conquerors," is taken from Romans 8:37: "Yet in all things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." Father Hilgenbrinck said the sessions will address modern issues with the Gospel message. "We want to be relevant at every moment and every year to what is going on in the world," he said.

Seminarians Ben Schoonmaker and Jack Swoik have been named prefects for this year's Emmaus Days. Both have Emmaus Days experience and several years in the seminary program.
