


Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Jesus went down with (Mary and Joseph) and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them..." (Luke 2:51). Saint



Joseph, Head of the Holy Family, Pillar of Families, and Glory of Domestic Life, pray for us! Obedience. It can be a tricky thing. Surely, we all have had times when we were certain that we were right, even if it meant that those over us were wrong. Have you ever considered that Saint Joseph was fallible and thus quite capable of being wrong in the commands he might have given to young Jesus? Yet, it is said that Our Lord was obedient to Mary and Joseph. This kind of humble obedience, which is willing to set aside the need to be right, is a way of being like Christ. That is why it is one of the three evangelical counsels (poverty, chastity and obedience), which are ways of committing to a particular type of imitation of Christ, according to the demands of one's own particular vocation. As diocesan priests, we promise obedience to the bishop - and we are reminded of it every time we use the formal, traditional mode of folding our hands in prayer, as this was the posture we took, when the bishop wrapped his hands around ours and we made that promise. I was recently explaining this gesture to our altar servers and shared that it reminds me of the freedom this obedience gives me, as well as the faithfulness of the Holy Spirit. I can trust Him. He instructed the Bishop to call me last September and if He had not, I would not be here now. I am very grateful. Most of us learn this obedience first in the family setting with our parents, as Christ Himself did in His own humanity. Perhaps many parents remember the times when their children first began to discover that one little word: NO. Of course, this powerful word is an important tool when used properly, as we must teach our children what they must say "NO" to and empower them to be able to say it. However, as the child continues to grow, their determination to decide for

themselves, what they will say "yes" and "no" to, often tends to grow stronger and stronger. The value of teaching, forming and guiding their discernment and decision-making, in order that they may make good use of their freedom, requires a strong relationship of trust. This is a reflection of our relationship with our Heavenly Father. He honors our freedom and wishes to help us to use it confidently and with a definite degree of autonomy. But, if we are to make good decisions, we must humble ourselves enough to obey His commands, even when we do not understand them. This is the starting point for growing in deeper understanding of these commands and of the Wisdom behind them. This is why Scripture tells us over and over again: "Fear of the Lord is the first stage of wisdom" (Proverbs 1:7, among other places). This is not a fear of harm, but the awe and reverence borne of the humble admission that He is God and we are not. This is also why the Church has taught down through the ages, especially since Saint Anselm (11th Century): Faith Seeks Understanding. We begin



from obedience, not because we are called to mindless submission, but because we begin from faith. We begin from trust. Do you trust the Lord? Reflect on this honestly in prayer and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you any wounds in your heart, which might make it difficult to trust Him. He loves to bring these wounds to the light, because it is in the dark where they continue to cut us deeper and deeper. It is in His Light that our wounds begin to be healed. Then, we can begin to trust Him. And believe it or not, the more we do so, the more we will begin to discover a deeper freedom than we ever thought possible.
