

Liturgy Leanings

We are continuing Ordinary Time into August with the 18th Sunday. Ordinary Time will end with the 34th Sunday on November 22. It comes from the Latin word Ordo, which means order in English and is the period of watchfulness and expectation for the second coming of Christ.

Some of the feast days during August are:

8/4 St. John Vianney - known as the Cure' of Ars.

8/6 Feast of the Transfiguration - when Jesus is changed in the presence of Peter, James, and John which highlights Jesus' divinity and glory.

8/14 St. Maximilian Kolbe - priest who offered himself as a substitute to save the life of a young father by their Nazi captors. 8/15 Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - At her death, God assumed her bodily into heaven where she now enjoys full union with her Lord.

8/21 St. Pius X - Pope Pius reformed the liturgy, promoted the Gregorian Chant, and lowered the age of first Communion, from 12 to 7 years.

8/28 St. Augustine - Bishop & Doctor of the Church, he was a theologian and philosopher. He died on 8/28/430 AD. From Hippo, North Africa, St. Augustine reminds us that God never gives up on us, even if at times we give up on ourselves or give up on him.



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

This month, we will notice that two key goals in the Liturgical calendar will be to draw us into a deeper understanding of the Eucharist and of the priesthood. This week (Wednesday), we have a special feast day: the Feast of Saint John Vianney, patron saint of parish priests (FYI, I will be away most of that day, for a gathering with some of the priests and seminarians of our diocese). If you think of it, could you offer a special prayer for all of our priests and for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, especially in our diocese and from our parish. Also, as I mentioned last weekend, we will be reading through the clearest teaching on the Eucharist in the Gospel (John 6) for most of the month. Understanding the Eucharist and the priesthood involves understanding the Passover. I highly recommend looking into teachings from the likes of Scott Hahn (*The Lamb's Supper, The Fourth Cup*) and Brant Pitre (Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist), in order to learn the specifics. If you choose to take up such a study, you will find the Mass coming alive for you, as your heart and mind are awakened to how central the Eucharist is to the Lord's marvelous plan for our salvation, at work throughout all of history! This will add a new dimension of appreciation to your prayer, when we read of the Holy Family's faithfulness to the custom of the annual Passover pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Thus, our monthly theme verse for the Year of Saint Joseph will be those words at the beginning of the story of the Finding in the Temple, which tell of this faithfulness of the Holy Family: "Each year His parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover ... " (Luke 2:41). May the Holy Family's faithful observance of the Passover inspire in us a deeper commitment and devotion to the fulfillment of the Passover, which we celebrate at every Mass! Saint Joseph, Most Faithful, pray for us!

Summer Not Over Yet: It is hard to believe that in a matter of days, our school will be back in session. And then, within a matter of weeks, we will be beginning to have parent meetings for the start of CCD, Confirmation Prep, and Youth Ministry (which has held a few events even through the summer). I also look forward to having news to share soon about resuming study and prayer groups for adult discipleship. But, before we call the summer ended, I am looking forward to sharing a fun day with you all for SummerFest (August 14th). I have heard great things about this relatively new event, which had just had its first annual event before having to take a year off because of COVID, and am looking forward to experiencing it for the first time. The part I'm not sure I'm looking forward to is that I was roped into taking the first shift in the dunk tank. So come out and dunk me... if you think you can, that is...
