A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Each year His parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover..." (Luke 2:41). Saint Joseph, Most Faithful, pray for us! Thus far in August, our bulletin reflections have focused on the Passover and the Eucharist, Faithfulness and the witness of Mary and Joseph. This week, I want to focus briefly on the connection between the Eucharist, the Priesthood and various other vocations. At the beginning of the month, I mentioned the significance of the priesthood, especially with regards to the Feast of Saint John Vianney. The Eucharist and the Priesthood are intimately connected. You can't have one without the other. The Lord instituted both at the Last Supper with the words "Do this in memory of Me," spoken to His first priests, the Twelve Apostles. The vocation of the priest finds its center at the altar, but so also does the vocation to holiness of all the lay faithful, who share in the common priesthood of all the baptized. In order to understand the difference between the common priesthood of the faithful and the ministerial priesthood of the ordained, it is helpful to think of the offertory at Mass. Once we are able to resume a procession of gifts, the outward symbol will more vividly manifest this reality, but the gifts to be offered are brought forward by the faithful and presented to the priest who offers them to God. These gifts principally include the bread and wine, which are transubstantiated into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. But, the gifts brought forward also include the spiritual offerings which the lay faithful have been "gathering" all week, as they live out their own unique vocation. This spiritual offering is visibly represented in at least two ways: 1) the collection, which is both necessary to help meet the needs of the Church (a concept which we will be elaborating on a bit in the weeks to come) and also is meant to signify the people bringing forth a piece of their livelihood (Luke 21:1-4, Acts 2:42-45, Acts 4:32-37); 2) the "third offering" that the priest offers in prayer, after offering up the bread and the wine, when he then makes a sweeping motion with his hands (as if gathering the prayers of all the people) and touches his hands to the altar as he bows. Thus, the altar becomes the meeting place whereby people of all vocations lay down the offerings of their lives, which they offer daily as they live out their vocations, so that they can be offered with Christ to the Father, in the Holy Eucharist. This is why it makes perfect sense that the Church has commonly spoken of the Holy Eucharist as the Source, Summit and Center of our lives as Catholics. In particular, for the priest, it is the absolute most basic thing that he was ordained to do, from which and back toward which all else flows. Thus, as we conclude the great Bread of Life discourse this weekend, it is worth noticing another subtle hint in the Scriptures of this intimate connection between the Priesthood and the Eucharist. We should remember that that fateful day when Our Lord multiplied the loaves for the multitude, leading into this teaching on the Eucharist, began with the return of those first twelve priests, after being sent out on mission for the first time. Consider how you have been called and sent out on mission. Next, consider what it means that the Eucharist is the place where you return from that mission and receive strength for the next stage of the journey. May Mary and Joseph pray for us that we may all discover this strength of the Eucharist more fully.

Congratulations To Our New Acolytes: As we consider different vocations and their relation to the Eucharist, I want to take this opportunity to congratulate our new acolytes being instilled this weekend by Bishop Lou at Sacre Coeur Retreat Center. As mentioned last weekend, these men in their wives have been heavily invested in the diaconate formation program for four and a half years now and this is an important step along the way toward ordination. Congratulations to Tom and Debbie Mattan and Bob and Shauna Thoene. Please keep them in their prayers, as they enter the final stages of preparation.




