

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

A Note From the Pastor

"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her..." (Matthew 1:20(b)). These words from the beginning of Matthew's Gospel may prompt us to ask Saint Joseph to intercede for us, as we reflect upon all that Jesus is telling us in this weekend's Gospel (Mark 10:2-12). When asked about divorce, Jesus wants to point us toward the beauty of God's plan for marriage and the family. In calling a man and a woman to make a lifelong commitment to one another, entering into a union of love that is to be free, total, faithful and fruitful. God is laying the firm foundation for a stable home into which children are welcomed and in which they grow to become the next generation of saints. So, it is indeed quite fitting that the very next thing Mark records Him telling us is, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." This is one of the most direct Scriptural sources for our Spiritual Theme for the year, which I introduced to the parish in last weekend's homily: Follow Jesus with the Faith of a Child. It also is a fitting Gospel message for this week's Respect Life Sunday, which kicks off Respect Life Month. As Catholics, we must recognize that the Lord's call to let the children come to Him echoes into our souls and calls us all to embrace the pro-life mission. This is truly NOT a political matter. It is an important part of how we respond to the Lord's own concern for His children. The pro-life movement, then, motivates our loving concern for both the children and the parents, which is why its work is not simply about preventing abortions, but also about supporting expecting parents in need, through the work of groups such as Women's Choice Center and Pregnancy Resources, and also about helping individuals who are hurting after an abortion experience find hope, healing and reconciliation, especially through programs like Rachel's Vineyard. But, even all of this is only the beginning, because our love for life lasts from womb to tomb, as they say. Thus, the dignity of all human life and the respect for life becomes the fundamental building block for all Catholic Social Teaching. It is intimately tied to our love for all of the poor, the weak and the vulnerable. Thus, if we are to devote ourselves to these needs beyond the womb, our concern for the vulnerable must begin within the womb. For this reason, it can be very confusing, misleading, and scandalous when we see public figures, whether it be an entertainment celebrity or a president or other politician, who both profess Catholicism and speak of seeking to meet these social needs, yet they also promote abortion and even try to defend it as a "right" and perpetuate the lie that it is a form of "healthcare." As Catholics, we must know that such examples are not to be followed because they do not represent Catholic faith, nor do they represent living in truth, and we must pray for ongoing conversion for all. Ultimately, what we must turn our hearts toward on Respect Life Sunday is the infinite and perfect love that God has for every human soul. Thus, it is with great joy that I begin now to elaborate (each week for the next five weeks) on a point I made far too briefly in last week's homily: If we are to follow Jesus with the faith of a child, we must begin with rebuilding the habit of praying to Him as a child, focusing on simply elaborating a bit on some of those basic phrases we learned as children: I Love You Too, Thank You, I'm Sorry, Please, and Yes, (that simple word that helps children develop the habit of listening and obeying with a cheerful attitude). As we begin by focusing on the first phrase, we come across the most simple four word prayer, which causes us to call to mind God's infinite and perfect love for each human soul, beginning with our own: I Love You Too. Why do we pray at all? So that God will grant our requests or give us consoling feelings? No. We pray because we love God and because He loved us first. Our choice to lift our hearts and minds to Him in prayer is our response to His Love for us. Take time today to remember God's perfect love for you. And tell Him that you love Him too. Saint Joseph. Most Courageous, Spouse of the Mother of God, pray for us!

Liturgy Leanings for October 2021

October is "Respect Life Month," as well as the "Month of the Most Holy Rosary." Sunday, October 3, is "Respect for Life Sunday," and October 24 is "World Mission Sunday." "Pennies for Life" will be collected this month.

Saints whose memorials are observed during October:

- 10/1—Saint Therese Martin— "The Little Flower," or "Therese of Lisieux:" her "little way" of doing small things with great love has inspired millions: died of tuberculosis in 1897 at age 24: a Doctor of the Church
- 10/2—The Holy Guardian Angels: traditionally believed that each person has been assigned an angel guardian, because every soul is precious to God
- 10/4—Saint Francis of Assisi: Born in 1182, died in 1226; In his youth he renounced his family wealth and dedicated his life to God, living in poverty, simplicity, and peace; founded an order of nuns.
- 10/7—Our Lady of the Rosary: Our Lady appeared to Saint Dominic and gave him the rosary as a way to convert those who were not Christians; Dominicans are credited with developing devotion to the rosary
- 10/11—Saint Pope John XXIII: Called Vatican Council II in 1959; visited the imprisoned in Rome, reached out to the sick, welcomed visitors of every faith and nation, modeled the Good Shepherd; Canonized July 5, 2013, by Pope Francis
- 10/15—Saint Teresa of Jesus, also known as Saint Teresa of Avila: a Carmelite known for her reforms of the Order, adopting a life of poverty and abstinence; her writings offer spiritual wisdom for a deeper union with God and neighbor; a Doctor of the Church
- 11/16—Saint Margaret Mary Alacogue: experienced visions of Christ and called attention to devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus
- 11/18—Saint Luke, the Evangelist: a Gentile, author of a gospel and the Acts of the Apostles; patron saint of physicians and artists
- 11/19—The North American Martyrs: Saint John de Brebeuf (1647) and Isaac Jogues (1648), Jesuit priests, who worked among the Huron nation in North America, where they were martyred
- 10/22—Saint Pope John Paul II: His holiness was reflected through his humanity and as a tireless, charismatic leader of the Church; started World Youth Day; visited the United States three times; canonized April 27, 2014, by Pope Francis
