It is the Lord who invites us into the desert, not simply to suffer the hunger and thirst, but to be there WITH HIM. Make time to spend with Him each day in prayer. Learn to Savor His Love in your quiet time of prayer each day, even if it's only a few minutes!

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners

Recently, I shared in greater detail about the retirement of Bishop Jenky and mentioned that he had called the priests to Peoria for a final event together, which was rescheduled due to weather. That final gathering took place last week and I wanted to share a bit about his final address to the priests.

By now, if you've read my bulletin articles and heard enough of my homilies, you are familiar with what I have come to term "The Five Things to Say to Jesus Every Day." It struck me that Bishop Jenky's simple words could be summarized by those five words or phrases. In hindsight, it does not seem surprising that he chose to keep this final address brief, simple and sincere. During a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration, he simply stood up in his pew (significant, considering how seldom his health allows him to stand or walk anymore), turned around and began to speak with no microphone. Then, he sat back down, leaving us most of the time to enjoy quiet prayer together with the Lord and with one another. Apparently, his desire was simply to pray together with his brothers and spiritual sons.

This was how he began, simply commenting on his own desire to *savor* this time. This is one way of describing what is meant by the prayer, "I love You too, Lord." We receive His love and savor it, hoping to rest in that love in a way that becomes a sharing and even a mutual, even if not equal, exchange of love. Still, he continued, "There are some things I need to say." Those words put us at the edge of our seats to hear what he had such a need to say.


The first thing he wanted to say: "I'm sorry." It wasn't the first time that I have seen his sincere, humble awareness of his humanity, including even his failings. It also wasn't the first time I have seen that he genuinely cares. Next, he offered some equally sincere comments about how he appreciates us and is grateful for his time with all of us in the Diocese of Peoria. Naturally, I think of that all-important prayer: Thank You.

Coming back to his original point of savoring our time with the Lord and one another, he next took the sentiment a step further and reminded us, "We need this."

In these words, we could hear an implicit plea to us to (Please) continue to prioritize and not neglect both our prayer and our fraternity. Indeed, we all need prayer, and we need community, friendship, human interaction. We must prioritize these things, lest we neglect them.

So far, whether implicitly or explicitly, we had heard "I love You too, Lord" (Savor His Love), "Thank you," "I'm Sorry" and "Please." Perhaps the most interesting aspect was how he bore witness to his "Yes" at this stage of life. He had spoken recently to us about his beginning to let go and embrace the rest into which the Lord was inviting him in this stage of life, as he hands the reins onto Bishop Lou. This time, he spoke a bit more specifically about his process of "easing his way back into religious life." As you may know, Bishop Jenky is a religious priest of the Congregation of the Holy Cross, based out of Notre Dame University in Indiana. His plans for retirement involve returning to his religious community, although it will not be easy to leave the diocese, he has called home for the past twenty years. Later on, in conversation, he elaborated even further about how this involves returning to his life of obedience to the superiors of the order, from which he is technically dispensed as a bishop, but which he is still embracing. There is something powerful about hearing the man to whom you promised obedience before God, on the day of your ordination, talk about embracing a life of obedience himself again! This is the essence of the "Yes" prayer: embracing obedience to whatever the Lord is calling us into, at each moment of life.

It is true that those same five words, which we ought to strive to say to Jesus each day, we must also say to one another from time to time. I am grateful that Bishop Jenky left us with this example in his final address. *Follow Jesus... with the Faith of a Child! And don't forget to savor His Love this Lent.*
