Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

Savor His Love and celebrate it with joy as you follow Jesus with the Faith of a Child! We have been at this whole following Jesus with the faith of a child thing for awhile now. So, how long are we to keep up this faith of a child? How far must we follow Him? Until the end. This is the only way. Part of the beauty of having that childlike faith is always remembering that we are only just beginning. As I write this, I marvel at the facts that, by the time you are reading it, CCD has already concluded for the year, our school is beginning its final week, youth ministry is moving into its summer schedule, and we are honoring our high school graduates this weekend at our 10:30 Graduate Mass & Reception. It does not seem that long ago that we were beginning this academic year with the new theme. "Follow Jesus with the faith of a child" and now that year is drawing to a close already. This weekend, as we congratulate and celebrate with our graduates, we stand with them in a posture of looking back with gratitude for every step of the journey that has brought us here... and also looking forward to the many steps that still await. Indeed, we are only just beginning.

Before we settle into the summer too much, allow me to highlight a few things coming up even in these summer months:

Coffee and Donuts: Next Sunday (5/22), we will have Coffee & Donuts after both Masses. A big thank you to Altar & Rosary, who has helped us get this great custom going again this year, as this is the second time they've hosted it for us in 2022. Knights of Columbus had their turn in February and chose to "upgrade" to a pancake breakfast. We look forward to other groups taking a turn in the near future as well.

Ascension, Pentecost & Trinity Sunday: After this, the next three Sundays are all special celebrations. First, we conclude the Easter Season with Ascension (5/28-29) and Pentecost (6/4-5). Then, the first Sunday back in Ordinary time is Holy Trinity Sunday (6/11-12), which will also include our June Children's Mass (10:30).

Corpus Christi & the EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: The second Sunday back in Ordinary Time after the Easter Season (6/18-19) is always Corpus Christi Sunday, in which we celebrate the mystery of the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi) truly present in the Holy Eucharist. This celebration will be especially important this year, as it kicks off a three-year Eucharistic Revival. There will be more information coming as this gets closer. But, these will be very special Masses. It is also Father's Day weekend, so we will still have the usual blessing for fathers at Mass, as well. But, since this is the beginning of a three year process, those who may be traveling for the holiday will have plenty more opportunities to be a part of this beautiful revival experience.

Dedication Anniversary (Saturday, July 2nd): As you may know, we have an 8:00 am Mass with Adoration and devotions on the First Saturday of every month, in honor of the Blessed Mother. In July, this Mass will be special, as it falls on the anniversary of the dedication of our parish church. Stay tuned.

A Visiting Priest (July 6-19): For two weeks, this summer, we are planning to have a visit from a priest from the Society of African Missions (SMA). At this stage, I ask for your prayers, as we are still awaiting confirmation, due to legal technicalities.

Steubenville Youth Conference: It has been a few years since Oasis has been able to host a trip to a Steubenville Youth Conference. We are very glad to be able to resume this beloved tradition July 15-17. Presuming there are no obstacles to our SMA priest's ability to cover the parish (see above), I look forward to being able to join them.

Totus Tuus: It is with great joy that I look forward to our first parish experience of Totus Tuus (July 23-29), a weeklong summer program, similar in many ways to Vacation Bible School, but with various additional elements. With a five day, day program for our younger children, a five day, evening program for our teens, and a midweek event for parishioners of all ages, this is a week to be sure not to miss!

Summer-Fest: Not long after that, we will conclude our summer with the return of our beloved parish event: Summer-Fest. Saturday, August 13th, Mass will be moved to 4:00 pm, in order to encourage as much participation as possible in this great community event. Stay tuned. By that time, we should have some exciting information about the upcoming year.

And that's just the summer! We have so much to look forward to. It's times like this that my heart goes to a favorite old praise and worship song ("God of this City" made popular by Chris Tomlin), which reaches a kind of climax with the repetition of the words: "Greater things are still to come... here." Let us indeed lift our hearts up with gratitude and hope to the God who is the One doing every good thing worth celebrating and looking forward to, remembering that we are still just beginning.
