



A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

One practical way that we can strive to live in the Presence of God, by making our Eucharistic Encounter with Him the true Source, Summit and Center in our lives is by "Living Liturgically." This simply means being aware of the Liturgical Calendar and allowing it to play a role in our lives, in our prayer, in planning our daily activities and perhaps even in selecting our wardrobe. Very basic examples might include remembering to offer some kind of sacrifice on Fridays and to set aside Sundays as a day of rest. Another example, of which some parishioners recently reminded me, is wearing red on Pentecost or wearing violet during Advent and Lent. Even more so, the more we begin to be aware each day of which saints we are honoring, which readings will be read or into which mysteries we are entering, the more we can potentially open ourselves to recognizing the Hand of God at work in our lives.

Last week, an important and historic moment unfolded in such a way that "Living Liturgically" helps us see how the Holy Spirit was at work. It was on the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and also on the calendar date that would normally be the Nativity of John the Baptist (if it were not transferred, due to it conflicting with the former, which is always on the 3rd Friday after Pentecost), that the Supreme Court decision took place, which overturned Roe v Wade.

How clearly we who support life can see evidence of the love and concern in His Heart, indeed His passionate plea, for every innocent child in the womb AND every mother in distress! It is very unfortunate that not every soul hears the cry of His Heart in this matter. Sadly, many simply recognize that a supposed "right" has been taken away and do not recognize the most fundamental right to life that was taken away from countless innocent children in 1973. Now is a time to remember that the compassionate and Merciful Heart of Christ still aches for the mothers who feel betrayed, lost and abandoned. This is why His compassionate heart has always moved the pro-life movement, not only to work and pray for an end to abortion, but also to seek out mothers in distress and direct them toward genuine healthcare and concrete assistance in their time of need. Likewise, it has also moved the Body of Christ to extend His Merciful Love to those who are hurting after an abortion experience, especially through post-abortion healing ministries like Rachel's Vineyard. Let us pray together that more souls would begin to hear the beat of His Loving and Merciful Heart and discover the endless love of the One who knit us together in the womb and loved us before our birth.

Remember also that, when we commemorate this day (June 24) in the years to come, we will be celebrating the Nativity of John the Baptist. The leaping of John the Baptist in the womb, when Mary carried the Christ Child (still in her own womb) to his mother Elizabeth, is often noted as a beautiful Scriptural portrayal of the life of the preborn child in the womb and of God's infinite love for these children. When John grew up, his life would end by being martyred in defense of God's plan for the family. May John pray for us all, that the Body of Christ would be that supportive family to every child and mother who find themselves in need.

This is indeed a unique moment to be commemorating our nation's Independence Day. Sadly, many people are hurting and angry, feeling that their nation is broken. While this causes our hearts to be saddened, we cannot help but be thankful and encouraged, filled with hope for our nation, as we see the right to life being affirmed at the national level. In the midst of it all, we see signs of widespread division. Yet, we also see signs that Our Loving and Merciful God has not abandoned us. Let us remember our duty as American Catholics to pray for our nation. May the Lord's healing and guiding hand lead us forward in hope, love and truth. Happy Fourth of July.
