

A Note From the Pastor

Hospitality, a Blessing



The sophisticated life we live today makes that everybody want his comfort, his space. Our homes are personal shelter that we invest in and treasure. We sometimes lock ourselves in our homes because it is where we feel safe. And for some of us, we like to have the peace to "recharge our batteries", especially on weekends or after a day of hard work. In this context, the stranger is seen with suspicion. We do not want him to disturb us.

Yet hospitality can help us maintain a healthy relationship with our possessions, as we make them available to God for his purposes. The practice of hospitality gives the Christian an opportunity to show what the Gospel is all about and provides a means to change the culture.

Two hospitality stories are proposed for our reflection. These two stories are very close to each other. In one hand, Abraham is very generous to the three men who approach his tent. The story of Abraham emphasizes his generosity in welcoming the guests. As soon as they approach his tent, he goes to meet them. He asks them to accept his hospitality. He shows them an extraordinary availability. What is surprising is that he addresses them as one person. He calls them "My Lord".

Abraham understood that by giving hospitality to these three people, he was welcoming God. This above fifteen century Icon of Andrei Rublev is often seen in the form of a mouse pad or magnet on refrigerators is used to represent the Trinity. It takes its origin from the hospitality shown by Abraham to strangers.

The Fathers of the Church saw in these three figures an image of the Trinity: three persons who are one Lord. By practicing hospitality, we come into contact with God.

On the other hand, In the Gospel Jesus receives hospitality in the house of Martha and Mary. In Other passages in the scriptures, we learn the goodness of the hospitality. The disciples of Emmaus welcome the stranger to dine with them and their eyes opened at the breaking of the bread. Thus God offers us the opportunity to welcome him though we do not see his image. However, I recognize that we recognize him in this assembly. His features are sometimes those of the stranger we barely look at. He is there, through the poor, the little one, the immigrant, the excluded; it is he who knocks at our door. At the end of our lives, he will say to us: "whatever you did to the least of my people, you did to me. This is a call for each of us to give generously in the service of God and our brothers and sisters

Arriving in this parish, the pastor gave me a list of the parishioners that will host me for dinner each single day. Is this act not the whole testimony of Hospitality? Do not neglect hospitality, because through it some have entertained angels without knowing it. Heb 13:2

### SMA PROVINCE OF IVORY COAST

#### Who are we?

The SMA Province of Ivory Coast is part of the SMA large family. The SMA is an international society of Catholic missionaries founded in the year 1856 in France by a French bishop called Melchior de Marion Brésillac. This missionary society is dedicated to spreading the Gospel in Africa and among the people of African origin. We strive to be a living witness of the Gospel of Jesus Christ among our brothers and sisters in the African continent. Fr Narcisse visiting St Malachy Church is the provincial superior of the SMA Fathers in Ivory Coast.

#### Where are we working?

First, we the SMA fathers come from all over the world and we serve in 16 countries in Africa (namely Nigeria, Benin Republic, Niger, Togo, Ghana, Côte D'Ivoire, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Egypt Kenya, D.R.Congo, Centre Africa Republic Tanzania, Zambia, Angola, and South-Africa.) We also serve in locations outside Africa where there is a large population of African heritage.

#### What do we do?

In the Province of Ivory Coast, the SMA Fathers provide both Spiritual and Practical care for those we serve, particularly the most forgotten and most abandoned.

As the provincial leader, my task is to provide welfare for the priest originating (48) and working (34) in Ivory Coast: retirements, allowances and health insurance .

We recruit and train Seminarians for the missionary priesthood. We have 27 Seminarians in formation.

I collaborate with the bishops with regard to Pastoral Assignment in the Church; we are entrusted with 13 Parishes in 8 dioceses in the country, where our priests proclaim and live the life of the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the people. We bring the Sacrament and the service of the church to them. We establish and support the local church, the Local Clergy and lay leadership.

- Education: We are involved in primary education, where we give less privileged children a good, intellectual, human and religious education.

- Health Care: In response to our charism we run a Medical center that takes care of Tropical Neglected diseases such as Burili Ulcer and other skin related pathology.

Presently, we are constructing, (with the help of a benefactor) a Dispensary in one of our Missions, to respond to the need of the people because they have to travel several miles to reach the existing health center.

We are involved in Justice and Peace and Integrity of Creation.

We do that through an NGO Rest-Cor (https://rest-cor.org/fr/)

For the past years with my involvement with the administration of our society and this new position has brought me to some hard realities on the missions. I have seen the cost involved in educating our many seminarians; the difficulties that many of our priest face on the missions; the joy that fill many of them from working with simple and ordinary people who have received and embraced the gospel for the first time in their lives.

To enable them to do the mission work in decent conditions most of our priests need support from the SMA leadership. The SMA has no support except you, the generous people of God in this Parish listening to me.

Our missionary endeavor cannot be successful without your generous donations. With your support, we can execute our missionary projects in the area of Education, Health and promotion of Justice and Peace and Integrity of the creation. And the care for our priests and the training of our Seminarians.

Jesus said in Mt 25:40 "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters that you do unto me" Pope Francis "To love God and neighbors is not something abstract, but profoundly concrete. It means seeing in every person the face of the Lord to be served."
