

August Liturgy Leanings

8/4 St John Vianney - patron of parish priests and known as the Cure' of Ars. Though not educated he was very intelligent and well versed in the faith. He rose to great sanctity, converted thousands of souls to Christ, became famous throughout the Catholic world. You might be familiar with the booklet, "Thoughts of the Cure' D'Ars". A Cure' quote "Life is given us that we may learn to die well, and ... to die well we must live well."

8/6 Transfiguration of the Lord when Jesus is changed in the presence of Peter, James, and John which highlights his divinity and glory. We may not have sat with Jesus on a mountain but if we are paying attention, we experience the transfiguration, the transformation of Christ in those around us - our "mountain moments!"

8/15 Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the first and best example of the glory of resurrection for human beings. Mary dies but she is taken into heaven that we might all know what awaits us after this life.

8/22 The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Blessed Mother has a special role on earth, and she has a special place in heaven. She is the Mother of God and Queen of Heaven

8/29 The Passion of St. John the Baptist. John pointed the way to Jesus, even when he knew it put his life in danger. Although we usually do not see persecution in the West, many Christians in other places regularly face terrible penalties for their beliefs. We must pray for those who face persecutions for their faith.

GRACE is when God gives us good things that we don't deserve.

MERCY is when He spares us from bad things we deserve. BLESSINGS are when He is generous with both.

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

We have much to be thankful for! Among many other blessings, my heart is filled with gratitude for our first ever Totus Tuus experience. Providentially, their focus for this year included the same topic as the Gospel, during our kick-off Mass last weekend: Prayer and the Our Father. The prayer that Our Lord taught us is far richer and deeper of a gift than we often realize. Hopefully, we learned it early on in life. This fact alone is a gift not to be taken for granted. When someone learns this prayer by heart, not simply as something that they were taught as children, but as something that they have learned to live and breathe from that point forward, it is beautiful to see how this prayer can become an anchor for them until the last moments of life, even in situations when little else has been spoken in days or more.

This prayer truly is a gift and yet it is so much more than words. Consider some of the insights offered to us in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, about its role in the liturgy:

"In the Eucharistic liturgy the Lord's Prayer appears as the prayer of the whole Church and there reveals its full meaning and efficacy. Placed between the anaphora (the Eucharistic prayer) and the communion, the Lord's Prayer sums up on the one hand all the petitions and intercessions expressed in the movement of the epiclesis and, on the other, *knocks at the door of the Banquet of the kingdom which sacramental communion anticipates.* (CCC 2770) reveals the eschatological character of its petitions. It is the proper prayer of "the end-time," the time of salvation that began with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and will be fulfilled with the Lord's return. *The petitions addressed to our Father, as distinct from the prayers of the old covenant, rely on the mystery of salvation already accomplished, once for all, in Christ crucified and risen*. (CCC 2771)

From this unshakeable faith springs forth the hope that sustains each of the seven petitions, which express the groanings of the present age, this time of patience and expectation during which "it does not yet appear what we shall be." The Eucharist and the Lord's Prayer look eagerly for the Lord's return, "until he comes." (CCC 2772)

Those three little paragraphs contain a great deal to be prayerfully digested. I invite you to consider taking them into some time of quiet prayer and reflection. How easily we can recite those words by rote memory alone and lose sight of the "hope that sustains" springing forth from the "unshakeable faith" in Jesus Christ crucified and risen, which emboldens us to dare to knock "at the door of the Banquet of the kingdom." Let us pay attention to the words we pray and open our hearts to the whole "mystery of salvation already accomplished, once and for all," contained within them in a powerful way. Let us begin now to enter more deeply into the way of life of a disciple of Jesus Christ: a life lived in God's presence!




