Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

A Note From the Pastor

Welcome back to The Search... And Where It Leads You.

As mentioned last week, for the next several weeks in the bulletin, I would like to discuss the content of the steps along the journey outlined in our current parishwide study, *The Search*. This bulletin letter series will not only discuss the given episode of *The Search*, but also other places on FORMED.org where you can go deeper on the same topic. The second session is "WHO ARE YOU?" It focuses on the beautiful mystery of the human person. Think of all the beautiful, mysterious and glorious realities within creation. Think of all the times that the beauty of something outside of yourself moved your heart to wonder. Now, consider that *you* are actually the crown of creation. Made in the image and likeness of God, with a body that outwardly reveals the invisible reality of the immortal soul, the human person reflects the glory of the Creator in a manner unlike anything else in creation. We cannot entirely fathom the dignity of the human person and the depth of God's love for us. For you.

So, where does this step in the search lead you? Where can you find more content to keep going deeper in appreciating the dignity of the human person? Well, there are a few different branches to explore. Let's consider at least a couple of them. Among other things, the reality of art is discussed as evidence of the reality of the soul. Many conversations about the value of art can be found on FORMED.org, especially in the "Sacred Art" episodes of Formed Now. One option I would recommend is the episode, "The Role of Art and Beauty in the New Evangelization: Ode to St. Cecilia." The purpose of this Formed Now discussion between Dr. Tim Gray and Paul McCusker was to promote the audio-drama about the life and influence of the great patron saint of art and music, Saint Cecilia. Along the way, however, the discussion becomes an opportunity to explore the importance of art and its role in spreading the Gospel in our modern world.

The next branch of the topic, however, is most fitting for this RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY, as it takes us into some of the pressing moral issues of our time, which threaten human life, such as abortion. Some people struggle with the notion, frequently proclaimed by leaders within the Church and within the pro-life movement, that abortion is the most pressing moral issue in our culture today. The reason for this bold statement is not that other great evils in our culture, such as sexual abuse of minors, for example, are any less evil or less pressing concerns. Both are acts of violence against the human person for which we must pray and work for an end. The difference is that the nature of the moral dilemma with abortion is not simply a need to more effectively combat the evil act of violence, but rather it is that many voices within our culture, our media and even our government are defending the "right" to directly perpetrate this act of violence against innocent children (namely abortion) and even working to make these acts of violence more readily available and frequent. The Enemy of our nature, namely Satan, has devised a brilliant plan to advance this attack against children, against women and against all of humanity by convincing his own victims that his attack on them is actually a service which they need. The weight of this apparent need presses hard on many women and other supporters of the pro-choice movement, because it is a distortion of a true need. A woman in a crisis-pregnancy situation of any kind is indeed in great need. The pro-life movement is concerned greatly with meeting the needs of women in these situations, to help provide them genuine solutions. It is not a lack of concern for the woman in need, but rather a greater concern for both her and her child, which seeks to direct her away from an abortion and toward genuine solutions such as those found in places like Woman's Choice Center and Pregnancy Resources, which Saint Malachy often supports. It is out of love and concern for both women and their children that the Catholic Church is and always will be unapologetically PRO-LIFE.

It goes without saying that the very idea of people celebrating the overturning of Roe v. Wade this summer has been upsetting for a significant portion of our population. On one level, this is understandable (and a reminder to us all to always remain humble and empathetic). The reason it is understandable is there is truth to the claim that something which the federal government had posited as a "right" for women was "taken away" in the sense that it is no longer affirmed as a right protected within federal law. However, we cannot forget that the most fundamental right, the right to life, was truly taken away from the child in the womb back in 1973. This is a grave and certain injustice that needs to be set right. The overturning of that failure in justice in 1973 was but one important step toward restoring that most fundamental right that was taken away. For this reason, the second recommendation that I would offer is *Changing Sides: How a Pro-Life Presence Changed the Heart of a Planned Parenthood Director.* This powerful personal testimony of Abby Johnson, told in dramatic documentary style, tells the moving story of a woman who previously vigorously defended this supposed right and gradually had her eyes and heart opened to the truth. She now works to promote the dignity and genuine rights of both women and children. Perhaps you're familiar with Abby's story. I was. For this reason, I hadn't taken the time to watch Changing Sides. I am glad that I finally did. Whether you or someone you know is struggling to fully embrace the Church's

Pro-Life mission or whether you are already convicted, but looking for encouragement, inspiration, and reinforcement, this will be worth the hour of your time. If you are someone who is troubled by this bulletin letter and planning to send me an email or ask to meet with me, I ask that you not do so before watching Changing Sides.

May we all celebrate the beauty and mystery of the human person as we seek to... Abide in God's Presence: Living from the Source, Striving for the Summit, Christ as our Center.

"I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer" (Luke 22:15).



Liturgy Leanings for October, 2022

October is "Respect Life Month," as well as the "Month of the Most Holy Rosary."

Sunday, October 2, is "Respect for Life Sunday," and October 23 is "World Mission Sunday." "Pennies for Life" will be collected this month.

During these final eight Sundays of the autumn weeks of Ordinary Time, green is the liturgical color.

Saints whose memorials are observed during October:

The memorials of two of the women Doctors of the Church, both Carmelite nuns, are observed this month Saint Therese of the Child Jesus (The Little Flower), on October 1, and Saint Teresa of Jesus (Teresa of Avila), on October 15. Saint Therese lived in Lisieux, France; Teresa was from Avila, Spain. Saint Therese is known for her "little way" of living as a disciple of Jesus: "Follow Jesus with the faith of a child!" Saint Teresa was a gifted writer of contemplative wisdom that continues to inspire anyone who wants a deeper union with God and neighbor.

10/2 - The Holy Guardian Angels

10/4 - Saint Francis of Assisi

10/7 - Our Lady of the Rosary

10/11 - Saint Pope John XXIII, who opened the Second Vatican Council on January 25, 1959

10/18 - Saint Luke, the Evangelist, author of a gospel and the Acts of the Apostles;

10/19 - The North American Martyrs, six Jesuit priest missionaries in upstate New York and Canada, who worked among the Huron nation

10/22 - St. Pope John Paul II, whose holiness was shown through his work as a tireless charismatic pastoral leader; canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014.


