

# A Note From the Pastor

Welcome back to The Search and Where It Leads You. As we continue this series, exploring places on FORMED.org where we can go deeper on the topic of each given episode of our current parishwide study *The Search*, we come to Episode 4: *What's Our Story*? Who doesn't love a good story?!! The most fascinating part of any good story is how it is capable of transporting the listener/reader/viewer into itself, as the imagination is carried into whole new worlds. And yet, this adventure in the world of the story, when the story is truly good and meaningful, sheds a kind of light of understanding onto their journey in the real world. But, what if the real world and the world of the story are one and the same? What if the story in question is truly *our* story, in which we are, not only characters, but co-authors? This is part of the boldness of the Christian claim: the greatest story ever told is truly your story and mine. The Center and Climax of that story is found in the Person of Jesus Christ. Thus, we will only understand our own story, the more that we come to know the One who is at the Center of the story. Even stranger still is the fact that we can only fully understand His life, death and Resurrection (the story told in the gospels) in the context of the whole of the story, which unfolds throughout the Sacred Scriptures. Studying the Bible not only helps us come to know God, who is revealing Himself to us through the written word, it casts a fuller light on the human experience. It is truly our story. If we are to write a chapter of that story by wielding the incredible responsibility of a free will, we ought to seek to know the story.


When it comes to how to answer the question of where I can go deeper on this topic, it's hard to know where to begin. When you search the different categories of content on Formed, you will notice guite a lot of options under the heading "Bible Study." Whether you want to simply binge-watch one of these many great bible studies, or digest them more slowly, engaging each episode with your Bible open in front of you or even with the workbook (some of which can even be found in pdf format directly on Formed, while others may need to be purchased), these studies would be beneficial ways to deepen your study of Scripture. Among these different options, you can see examples of three common approaches to Scripture Study. Sometimes if someone has only experienced one of these approaches, they may be less aware of the others. These three common approaches could be called Book-Based, Thematic, and Lectionary-Based. The title "Book-Based" does not imply that it is more focused on diving into Scripture itself than the other approaches, but rather that the topic of the study is a specific Book of the Bible (ex. the Lectio studies Mark and Phillipians; the Formed Now studies Galatians and the Gospel of Mark). The Thematic approach, on the other hand, utilizes different parts of the Scriptures to explore a specific theme or topic (ex. the Lectio studies God, The Case for Jesus, Salvation, Peter, Evangelization, Mary, Eucharist; the Formed Now studies on the different Mysteries of the Rosary; and The Bible and the Virgin Mary). Finally, the Lectionary-Based approach is focused on offering insight into the readings found in the Lectionary for Mass (ex. Opening the Word). Each of these approaches have different benefits, but all lead us deeper into our story and into greater contact with the living, breathing Word of God.

So, I've already mentioned quite a few. Which am I recommending? Well, all of them. But, my official "Where It Leads You" recommendations for this episode of The Search are a bit different. Only one is actually in the Bible Study section, namely *Our Story: A Basic Introduction to the Bible for Catholics*. After this basic introduction, I would recommend a different approach. *The Footprints of God*, with Steve Ray, provides a fascinating and engaging exploration of the world of the Scriptures. This more historical and geographical approach ends up feeling like a very entertaining travel log. Finally, I would also recommend *Anchored: 2020 Virtual Bible Conference*. This series of conferences is a great opportunity to learn from brilliant and faithful scholars, who have carefully chosen a few key books and passages in Scripture upon which to prepare an in-depth presentation. Throughout this series, you would also become familiar with some of the presenters of some of the other Bible Studies mentioned above. So, we end on the

same note we ended on last week: If we are to come to know the Lord better, we must begin to engage Scripture through both prayer and study, which inform and enrich one another. Any of these series would be an excellent guide for your study, which can greatly enrich your prayer, as you come to know personally the God who reveals Himself to us.

Abide in God's Presence: Living from the Source, Striving for the Summit, Christ as our Center. "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer" (Luke 22:15).


