



A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20). This weekend, we hear these words of our Lord to Saint Thomas the Apostle in the Gospel of John (20:29). The Resurrection is a mystery to be believed. That belief is meant to be the starting point from which we seek to see: to understand. experience and even feel His love. Often, we get it backwards. We think we have to understand the Gospel or to experience it personally or even specifically have a felt experience - to feel His loving presence - in order to believe Him and trust Him. That can certainly help. But, this is one of a few times when Our Lord is trying to help us to see how backwards it is to think those things need to come before belief! Another that comes to mind is when He tells Martha, after her brother Lazarus has died and she has not yet seen Him raised, but the Lord asks her to have faith first: "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" (John 11:40).

We are called to believe first. It matters that we experience Him and come to know Him, and as we do we will grow in understanding. But, we must accept, especially in difficult times like these stories that call us to hope for resurrection in the midst of death, that we are called to believe first. And if we don't trust the Lord, it will be difficult to arrive at that moment of encounter or of insight, in which we experience Him or begin to understand.

Last week, as we began Easter, I shared that Entering the Mystery means embracing the mystery of the Resurrection as a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated and to be lived. We are now concluding the Easter Octave, which focuses on *celebrating* that mystery! As the Easter Season continues (for quite some time as it's the longest liturgical season, besides Ordinary Time), we will focus even more on what it means to *live* the mystery. Yet, before we really settle into the rest of the Easter Season, we have this celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday, in which we have the story of the doubt and eventual coming to faith of Saint Thomas, prompting us to focus on the importance of *believing* the mystery.

It must have been difficult for Thomas to celebrate the Resurrection when he could not believe it. Indeed, I often think of how painful the alleluias of his friends might have been for him! But, all of our celebration and especially our living the mystery of the Resurrection flows from that first choice to believe, to trust. Faith is a gift, for which we must ask the Lord when we really need it. But, we also have to choose to receive it. It won't be forced upon us. Once we receive it, we begin to enter into the mystery, like stepping out of the empty tomb, heeding the words of the angel: "He is not here... He has been raised... Do not be afraid." The mystery begins to unfold for us and draw us into itself, until we find ourselves both celebrating and living that mystery with faith, hope and love. We enter the mystery together every time that we gather at His altar for the Holy Eucharist, where the Risen Christ is truly with us. Each time that we gather in the coming weeks of the Easter Season, we can enter more deeply into this mystery: Believing the Resurrection, Celebrating the Resurrection and Living the Resurrection.

As the River of Life streams from the Lamb (Revelation 22:1), so also from the altar flows the river of grace, which moves us to allow a stream of mercy and justice from that same altar, into the community around us. This is an important part of living the Resurrection, which is why I hope you can join us for the **Holy Hour for the Hungry** this Monday, April 17 at 7 PM, in which we will take up a collection for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry. Remember that, just as has been the case for each Works of Mercy Holy Hour, the collection basket will be available at the earlier hours of adoration (beginning at 3 PM), for those who cannot be present at 7 PM, but would like to offer prayers and a donation.

Your child can attend a Catholic School Financial Assistance Available



Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2023-2024 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2023-2024 school year must reapply.

Deadline date for the completed application is April 28, 2023. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2023.

Another funding opportunity is also available due to the Invest in Kids Act legislation in Illinois. Students may be eligible for up to 100% of tuition and fees under a new program for tax credit scholarships (TCS). Details on how to apply and who qualifies are available on the Empower Illinois website at www.empowerillinois.org. Students who receive a TCS are ineligible to receive a Spalding award.
