

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Lord, You will show us the path of life." These words of this weekend's Responsorial Psalm capture where we are in the Easter Season. We have entered the mystery of the Resurrection, celebrated it throughout the octave, and been challenged to believe it (through the story of Saint Thomas) on Divine Mercy Sunday. Now, we turn our focus to what it means to live the mystery of the Resurrection. That is part of the beauty of the length of the Easter Season. After the initial fervor of the celebration, in the octave, we settle into the season for a while, remembering that the mystery of the Resurrection is meant to be believed, celebrated and lived.

Living the Resurrection means living the new life He purchased for us. It was well described for us in last weekend's first reading: "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). As we strive to live lives rooted in prayer and the sacraments (breaking of the bread), we seek to better know the truth of who Jesus is and what He teaches (the teaching of the apostles), in order that we may live in accord with His plan for our lives (communal life). This communal way of living calls us to live, not for ourselves, but for the Lord and for others. This will call us to obey all of His commandments, but not simply by turning from sin and avoiding all of the things He tells us not to do. In addition, it also calls us to follow the positive example of active and loving concern for our neighbors. As the early Christians began living this way, people were amazed and wondered: see how they love one another! Little by little, the influence of this Christian witness helped to shape the most laudable values within our modern society. This witness is still needed, in order to allow our society to be continually transformed according to God's design.

One of our efforts to answer the call of giving positive witness of that active and loving concern for our neighbors, within our local community, has been the monthly Works of Mercy Holy Hours. Beginning in January of 2023, we have met on Monday night, at the conclusion of one of our weekly adoration times, to pray for a specific need and to take up a collection, which would address that need:

• At the Holy Hour for Life in January, we collected \$629.00 for Women's Choice Center and Pregnancy Resources in order to help babies and mothers in need in our area.

• At the Holy Hour for Peace in February, we collected \$1,132.00 for Aide to the Church in Need, in order to provide relief for Ukraine.

• At the Holy Hour for the Homeless in March, we collected \$1,024.00 for Humility Homes, in order to provide shelter for the homeless in our area.

• At the Holy Hour for the Hungry in April, we collected \$649.00 for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry, in order to help feed the hungry in our area.

Now, I would like to announce the final Works of Mercy Holy Hour before breaking for the summer: the Holy Hour for the Imprisoned (Monday, May 15). One of the corporal works of mercy teaches us to visit the imprisoned. For years, near the time of Mother's Day, our Social Justice Committee has sponsored a collection for an organization that has a unique way of helping to meet this need: Aunt Mary's Storybook Project, through which incarcerated mothers and fathers are given an opportunity to pick a book appropriate for each of their children and create a recording of the book along with a personal message. The books and recordings are sent to the children as gifts from their mothers and fathers. Started in 1993 as a Christmas project for the children of women imprisoned at Cook County Jail in Chicago, it has since become a year round program at many different prisons. Just as the Social Justice Committee collection has taken place near Mother's Day, so also this Holy Hour will be the day after. As usual, the basket will be available near the altar in the chapel during the earlier hours of adoration, for anyone who cannot be present at 7 PM, but would like to pray and bring a donation.

Part of the vision of these Works of Mercy Holy Hours, which conveniently began shortly after Christmas, is the witness of the Magi. They answered the call to come and adore the Lord. But, when they did so, they came bearing gifts. And in bringing gifts to lay before the King of Kings, they also managed to bring help to a poor family in need. Like the story of Mary and Martha, they provide us with a reminder that the Christian life involves both the active life and the contemplative life. Many of us are more naturally drawn toward one or the other. And like Martha, we can be tempted to judge those who are more naturally drawn toward the other. But, authentic discipleship of Christ calls us all to both. We are all called to prayer - Come, let us adore Him! We also are all called to give of ourselves to help those in need, in whatever way we can. Like the first disciples of Christ, may we all devote ourselves to the teaching of the apostles, the communal life, the breaking of the bread and the prayers.

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2023-2024 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2023-2024 school year must reapply.

Deadline date for the completed application is April 28, 2023. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2023.

Another funding opportunity is also available due to the Invest in Kids Act legislation in Illinois. Students may be eligible for up to 100% of tuition and fees under a new program for tax credit scholarships (TCS).
