From Fr. Claude

Peace be with you beloved,

I would like to begin this letter by expressing my gratitude to God the Almighty for bringing us together through faith and the Eucharist. I am also grateful to our Pastor Fr. Daniel Gifford and to each one of you for the warm welcome I received and continue to enjoy from you since I arrived here at St Malachy in Geneseo, IL. The family and spiritual nature of the community inspires me and challenges me as a baptized Christian and as a priest. I pray for the strengthening of this community, which is bound for the glory of God, that it may be a testimony to those who seek God.

Mission is the essence of the Church. On the day of his resurrection, in the evening, Jesus appeared to his disciples and said to them: "As the Father sent me so I send you" (Jn 20:21). On the day of his ascension to his Father, Jesus re-affirmed this missionary mandate he earlier gave to his disciples (cf. Mk 16:15). Over the centuries, the Church faithfully carried out this mission. Through various ways, the Church announced the message of salvation to people everywhere. In that line, Bishop Melchior de Marion Bresillac now Venerable, founded the Society of African Missions (with the acronym SMA) on December 8th, 1856 in Lyons- France with the aim of preaching the gospel to people of Africa and of African descent with the focus on the most abandoned- those in rural areas and/ or marginalized and to establish a local church with well- formed and respected clergy. At the first missionary journey in Sierra Leona, five (5) SMA missionary priests including the founder died in 1859. Receiving the sad news, Pope Pius IX exclaimed "A work thus begun shall never perish." This exclamation was in fact a prophecy.

After 167 years, the SMA with its 743 priests among whom 334 Africans (as of January 2023) is still much active and relevant in the mission of the church. The SMA Fathers are present in North America, Europe, Asia and in 16 countries in Africa telling through the celebration of the Sacraments, their simple life style and works of charity the story of Jesus who in the words of Benedict XVI (2005) *"gives life a new horizon and decisive direction."* Today, Africa has a youthful and vibrant local church due in many parts to the missionary endeavor of the SMA Fathers. This church has become missionary in turn sending missionaries to various parts of the world.

In Nigeria where I work, the SMA has forty-two (42) priests who work in twenty-five (25) parishes and in various ministries. The SMA Fathers, in the early life of the Society, understood that education is a key component to evangelization. So they established several schools that offer the people a holistic formation. Today, from among the many established schools, we run only four (4) (others schools were either handed over to the local church or to the state). Besides the schools, we run two (2) skill acquisition centers. These are: Self-Empowerment in Fashion Design (SEF) and Our Lady Undoer of Knots Fashion Design Center. These centers, though open to everyone, target mainly the youth and the women who are mostly unemployed or of low income. Today, we rejoice that around three hundred and forty (340) people have graduated from those centers.

Moreover, the SMA Fathers are involved in helping the people know and fight for their rights through a social justice group called Justice and Peace and Integration of Creation (JPIC). Jesus, answering the question of the Pharisees on the legitimacy of the payment of taxes to Caesar said: "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God" (Mk 12:17). Justice is an important part of evangelization whereby everyone is given his due. The JPIC carry out programs of sensitization on various issues of national and/or local concern such as human trafficking, domestic violence, sexual abuse, forced and child marriage, climate change and more issues that negatively affect the community; and when need arises it takes practical steps to address them. Here is an example: I worked in some areas where the culture allows parents to decide on who should marry their daughter(s) even against her (their) will. As a result, many girls run away from their family home and those who could not, were coerced into it. The JPIC got involved and in many instances, helped save the girls who were given the opportunity to choose by themselves their life partners.

Like a drop in the ocean, the SMA continues in spite of every obstacle to faithfully be a beacon of hope as it announces Jesus Christ "the Way, the Truth and the Life" (Jn 14:6).
