



A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!" (Romans 11). These words from our Second Reading this weekend remind us of how awesome, mysterious and glorious our God truly is. Perhaps it is even more amazing, when we consider this, that this same God wants to make Himself known to us personally, so that we can make Him known to the world. This is the focus of this Year of Missionary Discipleship, which we are relaunching beginning next week with the start of MISSION MONTH. You can see this bulletin for details

Last weekend's letter introducing this important month, designed to inspire us all to embrace the mission to make Him more widely known, ended on a kind of cliffhanger. As promised, I want to share with you some thoughts about how this month is a crucial time, not only to let Him make Himself known to us, but also to make Him more widely known in our local community. In addition to sharing with others both the information and inspiration you receive from these events and to simply inviting friends, family and neighbors to the events themselves. I have something else for you to think about. Providentially, Mission Month (September) is also the preparation for the start of OCIA (October), formerly known as RCIA. Additionally, we will be having an informational night before the class starts (September 26).

First, let me address the new name. Recently, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted on an updated translation of the complete ritual book, which was then approved by the Vatican. You may recall that the revision of translations, which began with the 2011 revision of the English translation of the Mass, has continued with addressing the translation of the various other important texts for the sacraments and prayer life of the Church. The process has taken years (already over a decade) and is still going, as you may recall my addressing that the words of the priest for the Sacrament of Reconciliation were updated last year - we now get to use the more

heavily Scriptural language of saying the Holy Spirit is "poured out" for the forgiveness of sins. The new translation for the ritual book formerly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the latest in these revisions and now has the title of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). This very subtle change may seem like it's just designed to confuse people, but it actually is a wonderful opportunity to re-emphasize that the rituals involved in the process are just that, a part of the process. Rituals are an important expression of human life, faith and culture. They point to something beyond themselves, namely the life of the Christian community of which they are a part. May OCIA always be experienced as an experience of entering more deeply into community with the People of God, that we may walk together on a journey of lifelong and ongoing conversion to Jesus Christ.

Second and more importantly, let us consider where the members of each "class" comes from. Getting straight to the point, they come from you. Each of us is a part of the mission of making Him more widely known. Therefore, each of us is responsible for praverfully considering who we might extend an invitation toward, to consider participating in this year's OCIA class experience. We can easily think of OCIA as a somewhat obscure venture in the parish, for the few people who have usually circumstantial reasons (for example, in the context of marriage or marriage prep) for considering membership in the Catholic Church. It is so much more than that. Rather than assuming all members of the "class" have merely circumstantial motivations, we should consider OCIA as a part of the process, in which the Spirit of the Lord moves in the hearts of people, whom He is drawing closer to Himself. When we remember this, along with remembering that the mission of the Church is to make disciples of all nations (all backgrounds), we begin to see that OCIA is one of the most important things that happens within the parish. Next week, I will elaborate on this point even further, when Mission Month actually launches. But, let us begin by asking the Holy Spirit for guidance in considering who we might invite.

St. Malachy's Rosary Makers Annual Rosary Rally in honor of Our Lady of Fatima's Miracle of the Sun will take place:


Saturday, October 13, 2023, at noon.
