

A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,



a new Church Year commences with the start of Advent. When we look to the Easter story in the Gospel of Luke, where our theme verse for the year is found, we might notice something. Just as the Liturgy of the Word prepares us for the moment when we encounter Him in the breaking of the bread, in the Liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass, so also the disciples on the road were similarly prepared by a revelation of how the Lord had already made Himself known in the Scriptures:

"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the scriptures" (Luke 24:27).

This will be a special theme verse for this Advent, as we explore how He has made Himself known in the Old Testament Scriptures, as God's people were being prepared for the coming of the Messiah. In these first three weeks of Advent, I will focus on a different aspect of God's Self-revelation in the Old Testament, beginning this week with the prophets, followed by the Psalms (next week) and ending with the story of Salvation History (Gaudete Sunday).

The prophets offer us a glimpse into the Heart of God and their words come to us an echo of Its beating, and at times breaking. People often make the mistake of defining prophecy as being primarily a matter of predicting the future. This is not the essence of prophecy and is not always found in every word of prophecy. In fact, often the future spoken of is something that the prophet is hoping to change, if only the people would heed his words and turn back to God. The essence of prophecy is hearing the voice of the Lord, who offers a word meant to be passed onto His people.

The prophet that we hear from the most in

Advent is Isaiah. The famous 20th Century Jewish scholar Abraham J. Heschel offers us some beautiful reflections on how Isaiah appears to us in the first (approximately) half of his book. "In the period in which he begins his activity, there is prosperity in the land. The king is astute, the priests are proud, and the market place is busy... People buy, sell, celebrate, rejoice, but Isaiah is consumed with distress... What is the issue that haunts the prophet's soul? ... How marvelous is the world that God has created! And how horrible is the world that man has made! The essence of blasphemy is confusion, and in the eyes of the prophet confusion is raging in the world" ("The Prophets," pgs. 97-98). Does not something in these words ring almost hauntingly true? With so much brokenness in our world, the temptation is incredibly alluring to allow the external trappings of the "Christmas season" (which we confuse with the Advent Season) to become an escape... into a busy market place, which plunges us into this world and often makes it harder and harder to hear the voice of God, which is the one thing needful in Advent. In the first half of Isaiah (sometimes called "The Book of Woe"), the prophet is calling Judah, both the king and the people, not to turn toward worldly solutions to our problems, but to turn back to God. This is the call of Advent, as we prepare for the Second Coming and for the celebration of the First Coming during the Christmas Season.

Heschel also writes, "The prophet pleads with us to understand the plight of a Father whom His children have abandoned... There is sorrow in God's anger. It is an instrument of purification, and its exercise will not last forever... Anger is not His disposition, but a state He waits to overcome." Often, we fail to understand how even the 'woeful' words of the prophets, (not to mention of Our Lord Jesus!) reveal the great love of God, a Father whose Heart has been broken.

Sadly, Judah did not sufficiently heed the words of Isaiah and were sent into exile by Babylon. After years of exile, the voice of Isaiah reemerges with a very different tone. Heschel is somewhat famous for describing the prophet as one who "comforts the afflicted and afflicts the comfortable." While the "Book of Woe" seemed more like the second part of that description.

when Isaiah returns to speak to the exiles, he is so focused "You, LORD, are our father, our redeemer you are named on the first part that the second part, beginning with forever" (Isaiah 63, this weekend's First Reading). Chapter 39, is often called the "Book of Consolation." All of our Sunday Lectionary readings from Isaiah this Advent will come from the Book of Consolation. The Lord wishes to offer comfort to our hearts, just as much as He wishes to shake us from complacency, which often keeps us lukewarm in our faith. And ultimately, the words of comfort that we hear from Isaiah are so fitting for Advent because the hope of which they speak is not simply that of returning to the promised land, but the promise of the Messiah, Who is coming to bring us home for the first time to the Promised Land of Heaven.

So, let us thank God for the gift of the prophets, through whom the Lord offers us a glimpse of His Heart.

St Malachy Memories

Mary Thompson:

I started St. Malachy School in 1946-Grades 1-8 with the Dominican Nuns. There was no kindergarten-two grades in each room. We would start with Morning Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Religion was with the Baltimore Catechism. All Masses were in Latin. Boys could be Altar servers (No girls at that time). The 7th-8th grade girls were in the choir. First Friday was a special day as we had hot cocoa and rolls after Mass.

Recess was on the playground with some of the boys playing ball or marbles and the girls playing jump rope or jacks. For lunch we would bring sack lunch or, if close to school, we could go home for lunch. We also had programs in church hall and special movies in the lunchroom and even learned square dancing).

I graduated from the 8th grade in 1954 and Geneseo High School in 1958, and married in 1959. My four children (Chris, Cindy, Carla, and Craig) went to St. Malachy School. When my youngest was there, they started Grandparents' Day (What a great event). They also started the Lasagna Supper. I also had the privilege of five of my grandsons going to St. Malachy School (Jared, Nathan, Reed, Noah, and Keaton). I became Lunch Lady in 2000 till 2018, I loved every minute of it and would be there now if I could!!! I still love to go to the CHRISTMAS PROGRAMS!!! Thank you St. Malachy School for all the memories!!!

Mary Anne Peterson:

Following are a few of the memories I have from St. Malachy School.

Hot cocoa and large cinnamon rolls were served for First Friday Breakfast in the school basement for all students by Mother's Club.

Sister Marie Dorothy, 3rd and 4th grade teacher, was my favorite teacher.

We always wore dresses - no slacks or jeans back then.

The whole school riding in big dump trucks went to an all school picnic at Connie's Grove at the end of the school year.

Father Ross read our report cards out loud in front of the class which made you work hard for good grades.

We went with Sister Mary Margaret over to church after school each day to lay out the Priest's vestments for Mass the next morning and took care of anything that needed to be done on the altar, such as candle replacement etc.

In first grade, I had to sit with an 8th grader for Music to learn the Latin

Mass. We had to stand and sing alone to prove we knew the words and still do until this day.

We had to sing at morning Mass everyday. Town kids were mandatory and bus kids had to come and sing whenever they arrived.

I was a Diploma bearer for Dorothy Bolte DeReu at 8th grade graduation. A 1st grader was asked by each graduate to carry a diploma in a procession in front of the graduate and hand it to Father who later presented it to each of them during the Mass and ceremony.


