A Note From the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the scriptures" (Luke 24:27). We continue the journey of exploring how God prepares us to encounter Him in the breaking

of the bread, by revealing Himself to us in the Scriptures, beginning in the Old Testament. We have already focused on the prophets and the psalms. As promised, we will focus on the story of Salvation History this week.

In this Third Week of Advent, as we reach the great turning point of Gaudete Sunday, in which the light of Christ coming very soon begins to dawn, it is fitting to focus on the story. Jesus is the center and climax of the story. Hope entered the scene the moment that our Savior came to live in the womb of the Blessed Mother. On Christmas day, when His eyes first opened upon this broken world longing to meet its Savior, it was like the rising of the sun, after a long dark night. "In the tender compassion of our God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death and to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Luke 1:78-79). This is the cause of our joy.

But, this prompts us to ask, where did the darkness come from? Well, in order to understand that, we have to begin with the original beauty and splendor of light, which is God's glorious creation. In His infinite goodness, God created the world out of love with harmony, unity and purpose. At the crown of that creation is the human person, made in His image and likeness, made for communion, made for love. We can far too easily forget that it is not our weakness, failures and sins that make us human, but rather this original purpose for which we were made. God made us for communion with God and one another.

The most dangerous and beautiful gift God gave us was free will. While it was necessary in order for our love to be authentic, it also made the rejection of God's love and grace possible. Thus, sin entered the story when our first parents, Adam and Eve, believed the lies of the serpent (who is actually the fallen angel Lucifer, now known as the Devil or Satan) and freely chose to disobey God. Sin compounded with each proceeding generation, as the first murder was

committed by one of their sons, against the other. Sin is what brings division, destruction and all forms of evil and suffering into our world and it only progresses further through the years. But, God never gives up on those He made for communion with Him. Just as Adam and Eve had been in covenant with Him, so also He established a new covenant with Noah. And later with Abraham, He established a new covenant grounded in a promise which would find further fulfillment in the proceeding covenants with Moses, David and the long awaited Son of David, the Lord Jesus Christ. But, now we're getting ahead of ourselves.

In Moses, God had shown mercy to a people who had grown inclined toward their own destruction, toward sin. by giving them the law, a very clear set of instructions to help them avoid sin. In David, He established for them a kingdom, uniting them with purpose and governance. David sinned, as did his successors, but God promised that one day there would be a "son of David" (one born of his line) whose kingdom would have no end. However, as the sins of the kings and the people compounded over time, more devastation resulted and the kingdom itself began to seem hopelessly far away. First the kingdom was divided into two, only to later be sent into exile. After the exile, the earthly kingdom would never be reestablished. Even after being restored to their land, they found themselves beneath the yoke of foreign rulers: Persia, Greece and finally Rome. Thus, the promised son of David came to be understood as a messianic figure, a savior who would finally deliver them and restore them. We learn about this Messiah from prophets such Isaiah, Jeremiah and Daniel. With all this in mind, we can begin to understand all the more clearly the weight of the words of the angel to Mary, about the Child to be conceived in her womb: "the Lord God will give Him the throne of David His father... and of his kingdom there will be no end."

Yet, over time, weighed down by all of the suffering that sin had wrought, they misunderstood that from which this savior was meant to deliver them. It was not merely from the suffering heaped upon them by their worldly oppressors. He came to deliver us from the source of all suffering: sin. Thus, the One they awaited came with a greater deliverance than they could have imagined. While it would not mean a deliverance from suffering, through this same suffering, God had taught them to hope in their savior, who would bring them home to the Lord Himself. How great is our God! So, let us join our hearts to the words of Isaiah in this weekend's first reading: "I rejoice heartily in the LORD, in my God is the joy of

mv soul."

St Malachy Memories

My dad Robert L. Egert Sr., went to St. Malachy Church and school when he was young. I have been blessed to be a part of the St. Malachy Family for 72 years. St. Malachy School was only one block from our home. I started school in 1957 at the age of 6. My brothers Bob and Rick were already going to St. Malachy school and would walk with me every day back and forth. We also walked home for lunch at that time too.

We had Dominican nuns in our school except when I was in 4th grade, we had a lay teacher step in for the school year. The first grade was very exciting, and Sister Nilus was my teacher. I thought she was beautiful and amazing. Over the years my siblings at home joined us at school: Jane, Randy, and Sue. When the first 4 of us went,





there were 8 grades. By the time Randy and Sue graduated St. Malachy school, it had changed to only 6 grades. Mass was available every morning which we attended. The kids who rode the bus would come in as the buses arrived. School would begin shortly after Mass was over.

The classrooms held two grades per room. First and second grade were on the first floor along with seventh and eighth across the hall. Third and fourth grades along with fifth and sixth grades were located on the second floor. The dress code was dresses for the girls and collared shirts for the boys. When I was in seventh grade, uniforms were introduced but were optional. My parents made us wear uniforms. Maybe they didn't like my plaid shirt and striped skirt which is very much in fashion today!

Our Confirmation class consisted of 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students. The Bishop came to perform the ceremony. The Sister's had us very well prepared for any question he might ask us. (Continued on next side)

Like my Godmother, Virginia Wachtel, I also loved the May Crowning of our Blessed Mother. The girls wore their most fancy church dress and one by one proceeded up the aisle carrying a flower to put in a vase around Mary. In first grade, I was picked to carry the crown down the aisle, and in eighth grade chosen again to help place the crown on the statue of Mary. I was very honored to have had these along with so many memories the school provided.





Living close to St. Malachy's my sisters and I would be called on to help sing at funerals (which were all in Latin), and my brothers called to serve Mass whenever needed. My grandma lived with us and prepared extra food every day because if someone forgot their lunch, the Nuns would send them home with us as we walked home for lunch. My father was Taxi/Uber to the Nuns as he would pack them in our station wagon and take them back and forth to Sinsinawa, Wisconsin, when needed.

I was very blessed with a loving young couple (Harley and Mary Chaffee) who taught CCD and continued to further my journey with the Lord that St. Malachy school had begun.

I have been very blessed to have St. Malachy Church and School in my life. Now I'm enjoying my grandson Shawn going through this school.
