Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, He interpreted to them what referred to Him in all the scriptures" (Luke 24:27). We have been using these words as a

special theme verse for this Advent Season, since our theme verse (Luke 24:33,35) for this Year of Missionary of Discipleship comes from this same story. Our Advent 2023 theme verse reminds us how Jesus prepared them for the moment when He would make Himself known to them in the breaking of the bread, by first breaking open the Scriptures for them in the Old Testament. As we have seen this Advent, throughout those earlier pages of Scripture, The Lord made Himself known to us as Our Father, Redeemer and Potter, our Patient Shepherd. Healer, Comforter our and Liberator and Vindicator, and as Father to the King, who is our Messiah, our Savior. Now that Advent is coming to an end and we begin to celebrate the birth of our Savior, our hearts are bursting with joy.

As we welcome the Christmas season. may our hearts be filled with joy that the specific places to which He calls us. Savior has come and let that joy overflow into wonder. This is part of the beauty of Christmas. Celebrating His birth is just the beginning. Throughout the season, we continue to wonder at the mystery of the Incarnation.

St Malachy Memories

Mary Gillespie:

I was born in Moline, IL, and attended Sacred Heart School. In the summer of 1966, our family moved to Geneseo, and I and my younger sister enrolled in St. Malachy. That year the new wing of the school was opened. The older school was now occupied by kindergartners through 4th grade, and the new building contained 5th through 8th grades, plus the Principal's Office. St Malachy was different from Sacred Heart in that we did not have to wear uniforms, but like Sacred Heart, no pants for the girls nor shorts were allowed. Another difference was that at St. Malachy, we would switch classrooms for the different subjects. The 5th grade teacher (Mrs. C) taught English, Spelling, and Handwriting. The 6th grade teacher, (a Sister) taught Math. Mr. Lavery, the 7th grade teacher, taught Social Studies/ History, and the 8th grade class was very large, and I made a lot of new friends. We enjoyed recess time when we would hang out on Russell Ave. between the Convent and the open lot next to St. Malachy Church.

My 2 older sisters had been cheerleaders at Alleman High School in Rock Island, IL, so I knew a lot of the cheers and we would practice them and make up some of our own.

Each of the teachers had their unique methods of teaching. In 5th grade, we would practice our handwriting using a fountain pen, which was very messy. In our 6th grade class on Friday afternoons, we would move our desks around to do square dancing. Sister really enjoyed teaching us to dance and we all looked forward to Friday's fun. On Monday, Mr. Lavery would do an inspection of our shoes and would choose whose shoes were the cleanest, the girls or the boys. Every Sunday, we would polish our shoes for the next day's inspection. When we got to school the next morning, there would often be a playful battle between the boys and girls, hoping to dirty each other's shoes, which sometimes led to lack of recess.

I enjoyed First Friday Masses. I loved the songs that we sang and the quiet time for prayer. When we got married, my husband and I agreed that we would enroll our children in St. Malachy School and now along with our 6 sons, we have been blessed to have our grandchildren experience the blessings of our St. Malachy school and church.

Rick Hull:

I was a student at St Malachy School from the fall of 1958 till the spring of 1966. The St Malachy school building was still the original brick building housing 7 grades with the 5th grade in a section of the old church basement. My teacher in 1st grade and 2nd grade was Sister Naulis, Sister Joesett was 3rd grade and 4th grade, Mary Ellen Buckley was 5th grade, Sister Chabenal and Sister Engratia were 7th and 8th grade, and Sister Latisa was the principal. Joanne Gernant, Mrs.Violet Munson and Sam Morrissey were lay teachers who also taught during this time. The Parish priests were Father George Herbach, Father Robert Creogeor, and Father Robert Ryan who replaced Father Creogeor as Assistant.

My education at St Malachy was very good. My day started with Religion class, Bible reading as well as the Saint Feast Day readings. This was followed by normal subjects like English, Arithmetic, Reading, Phonics, History, Geography, Science, and the day ended with prayer.

A few events left lasting memories. The Cuban Missile Crisis in October 1962. Russia had missiles pointed at the southern United States, but President John Kennedy got Russia to pull out with peace talks. The time was very dangerous and students all across the country had to prepare with drills in safe zones like in basements of schools just in case of war. Another event that occurred was the assassination of President John F. Kennedy on Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas, Texas. Both events were very alarming and troublesome.

A Joyful Word

What's Your Word of the Year

It's that time of year again where many people make New Year's Resolutions. They may choose to exercise more. Eat healthier. Read a certain number of books. Or even pray more.

All of these things are good as they are meant to evoke a positive change in one's life. However, often once February arrives, those resolutions go by the wayside.

Have you ever chosen a personal word of the year to focus on instead of trying to make some other change?

The purpose of choosing a word for the year is that throughout the year, it will come back to you and you can see how God is using it to either make changes in your life and/or to grow closer to him.

Did you choose the word? Or did a word choose you?

I don't choose my word of the year. It comes to me, generally in December or January, and sometimes it surprises me. It's something that's been happening for me for the last six or seven years.

Sometimes I share the word. Sometimes I just hold it inside myself. But it's something that I pay attention to, focus on, pray with, and embrace throughout the year.

It could be tempting to try to choose a word that will "inspire you to be better" or to pick one that's in line with your New Year's Resolution. Maybe you have some favorite words you just love the sound of, or that seem like they describe the kind of person you want to be, or the kind of life you want to have.

Your most powerful Word of the Year might not be any of that. The one that fills your entire being and permeates your actions



might be something you never intentionally thought of.

In order for your personal word of the year to find you, you really have to take some time and intention to feel whatever it is you're feeling.

Ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten you on what it is that the Lord is asking you to focus on this year.

Once you start noticing certain words or themes, try them on as your personal word of the year.

Don't feel like you have to commit to them, and don't worry about them being right or wrong for you. But when a word or concept begins to stand out to you, pray about it daily and then keep your eyes open to see what surprises the Lord has for you. What lessons do you need to learn?

This year, the Holy Spirit has brought the word **openness** to me. Personally, I know there are areas in my life that I need to be more open. Open to the ideas of others. Open to the gifts the Lord asks me to share. And open to see his goodness. I look forward to see how this word will penetrate my being this year.
