A Note From the Pastor


Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,



"Then they said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" (Luke

24:32). These words of our theme verse for this brief little Christmas Season within the Year of Missionary Discipleship are especially fitting for the Feast of the Epiphany! The mystery of the epiphanies are all about God making Himself known.

Of course, first and foremost, we think of the Adoration of the Magi, who came bringing gifts. In this



moment, the infant Jesus was revealed as the King of all kings. Yet, the Church also recognizes both the Baptism of the Lord and the Wedding Feast at Cana

as epiphanies. At the Baptism of the Lord, He was revealed as the Beloved Son of the Father. And at the Wedding Feast, He was made known not only as a miracle-worker and the One who makes all things new, but also as the Bridegroom of the Church.

Granted each of these revelations was still veiled in mystery at the time, leaving others wondering at what they had just witnessed. Like Mary pondering all things in her heart and like Cleopas and the other disciple on the Road to Emmaus noticing their hearts burning within them, so also these epiphanies left people in a state of wonder, longing to know, longing to understand, as they abide in faith.

The gospels mention on numerous occasions that His disciples did not understand much of what He said and did until after the Resurrection. Yet, even then, His revelation involves a progression in which faith seeks understanding. We see this in the fact that a number of His disciples, including these two on the road, did not recognize Him at first. Once He made Himself known to them, they began to understand the burning within their hearts. As we celebrate the Epiphany, may we notice our hearts burning within us, longing to know, longing to understand, as we abide in faith.

May the wonder of Christmas continue to fill your hearts and your homes.



St Malachy Memories

Saint Malachy School Christmas Programs - Mary Frimml

I will begin with some background of my time as a teacher at Saint Malachy School. The 1989-1990 school year was the first for students and teachers of Saint Malachy School to begin their learning and teaching in the current building. This move into a new facility also was the first school year that the teaching staff included "in house" music, art, and physical education teachers. In the past, those subjects were experienced at North Side School, a block north of the "old" Saint Malachy School. I was hired to teach music two days a week and coordinate the weekly school liturgies, the first "in house" music teacher for the parish school since the Dominican sisters left the parish in the 1960s. I continued as the music teacher until the end of the 2004-2005 school year, but continued to be the liturgy coordinator through the 2020-2021 school year. I also was the accompanist for the school liturgies, except for the years when Mrs. Martens played the guitar for the school Masses.

The school Christmas program that is performed in mid-December, is a highlight of each school year. As the school music teacher, my responsibilities included a role in the annual Christmas program, which is a project that is shared by the entire faculty. The performance is divided into two parts: first, the students in grades K, 1 and 2 perform two songs, (each of those grades performs individually), as well as one song that those three grades perform together. Part Two features the intermediate grades, third through sixth, as they perform a published musical play that is chosen by their teachers. The sixth grade assumes the character roles, while the 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students are the choir; each of those grades is also featured in a song. The songs of the play, and the songs of the primary grade students, are taught in music class in November, while the script is rehearsed by the 6th grade in their classroom until rehearsals of script and music are put together in the church. It is a very big undertaking! I also served as the accompanist for the programs each year that I was teaching and beyond, until about 2020.

The first play that was performed (1989) was called "Angels Aware." The script tells the story of how God came to earth as a baby, and features three groups of angels—Herald, Seraphim and Cherubim—as well as the major and minor prophets. This play teaches more than music to the students, and is a challenge to produce. During my years as the music teacher, this play was performed four times! "Christmas Around the World," is a beautiful play that features the customs and costumes of many countries. There were several plays that were rotated through the years, and each was performed more than once. The plays include not only a story with a message, and songs that help to tell the story, but also some humor. They often reveal the potential of many Sixth Graders for their future involvement in speech/drama experiences after they leave our school.

School Memories by Joshua Anderson

It's hard to drive past the old school building on E. Park Street and not marvel at how small the playground area has become. In my memory as a young elementary school kid, that playground was as big as Wrigley Field or Soldier Field. (and it held as much opportunity for glory as those two notable stadiums!) Hijinks and crazy little boys ran amuck as Mrs. Huslander, Mrs. Bassier, and principals tried to corral the mayhem. Learning to jump off the swings, monkey bars, and jungle gym proved our mettle. Kickball was king, and we made legends out of the older kids, like Josh "Boom" Boone who could "boom" the ball farther than anyone else. This led to many arguments.

I remember the small cafeteria in the basement that doubled as the P.E. location during the winter. For Hot Lunch we were walked to Northside School (my favorite was chili with cheese sticks). We also used the basement for skating and "Motor Moms". We even used the basement for Christmas pageants when I was in third grade, we moved to the new school on Ogden Avenue. I remember a parade to the new school. The school was so modern, and I remember feeling lucky and almost wondering if we deserved something that nice. The new playground had so much room and so much to do. Football soon became king with all the extra room to run around. Of course, just like today, the boys were always trying to go "over the hill" without the teachers catching us!

Looking back, of course, the impact of the teachers and staff was the most important. They gave us a safe place to be wild and learn our limits. Mrs. Osbourne, the principal, helped us learn a lot as we grew older. I remember sitting in a circle with Mrs. Lavery, in kindergarten. She was going around the circle asking us about our family. When she came to me, I was stumped because she asked my parents' names. Mom and Dad had real names? I remember drawing in second grade. Mrs. Ruskin and the whole class were surprised that Tom and I had drawn the same picture while we were sitting at opposite sides of the room. They attributed it to a "twin thing". I remember Mrs. Kanke igniting a love for creative writing in fourth grade as she challenged us to write a sequel to Mr. Popper's Penguins. Last, I remember getting sent to the principal's office and crying, "Dad's going to spank me!" so loudly that my older sister heard me in a nearby classroom.


