Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." (1 Corinthians 10:31). In their simplicity, these words in our second reading for this weekend serve as a very appropriate exhortation in the moment of transition in which

we find ourselves. Having had a very full few weeks of Ordinary Time, after Christmas, it is hard to believe we are already preparing to dive into the holy desert season of Lent later this week. With such an early start to Lent, it seems fitting that last week's 100 Year Celebration for Saint Malachy School seemed like a crowning moment on all that has come before, a kind of "final hoorah," as they say, before shifting our focus. Again, I want to express my abundant thanks to all of the committee members who worked tirelessly to prepare for and execute that beautiful event, as well as our teachers, students and families, and all who supported the event in any way, by their presence, by contributing their members and by helping to spread the word. And I am also thankful to Bishop Lou Tylka, our bishop, for making the trip to celebrate with us. Of course, that event was marked by a spirit of both looking back with great gratitude and also looking forward with great hope.

Now, let us look forward. Today, I want to share an announcement about three things coming up, to which we can look forward with confident hope. They are (1) the holy seasons of Lent & Easter, (2) our next Totus Tuus program this summer, and (3) our next parish mission, in November.

**LENT 2024:** A Three Step Journey. This will be our parish wide focus this year. These three steps are simple.

**Step One: "Repent & Believe in the Gospel"** (Mark 1:15, also spoken on Ash Wednesday). We are encouraging our parishioners to make a good confession and receive the grace of this sacrament early in Lent (February 14-29). Don't wait. The sacrament will remain available after this point, but I encourage you to celebrate it early if you can. As Jesus entered the desert right after His baptism, so let us enter by being restored to the grace of our baptism. This year, we will again be doubling the Confession times for Lent: 12-12:30 on Monday-Thursday, in addition to the year round times on Monday (8:45 AM), Tuesday (8:45 AM), Thursday (5 PM) and

# Saturday (3:30 PM). We will also have a *Holy Hour with Confessions at 7 PM on Thursday, February 22nd.*

Step Two: Dive Into the Good News (*The Gospel of Mark Challenge*)! The concept is simple. Beginning on March 1, read one chapter of the Gospel of Mark each day, until March 16. You can even "level up" by tuning into Thursday Thoughts, for weekly reflections, and/or by doing this with a group and meeting weekly for discussion and prayer together. It should be noted that when we read Scripture, it should never be simply either merely casual or merely academic. We read to listen to the Word of God. So, pray first and read slowly.

Step Three: Embrace the Cross! The last two weeks of Lent are called "Passiontide," when our focus turns toward the cross. In these days (March 17-30), I encourage everyone to pray the Stations of the Cross, either individually or at a scheduled time. Other ways to enter into this third step include reading the Passion, praying the Sorrowful Mysteries, especially in Eucharistic Adoration or watching "The Passion of the Christ" or a classic like "Jesus of Nazareth" (1977). Stations of the Cross will again be offered every Friday at Noon and 7 PM, but can also be prayed individually and as a family, which helps you set the pace for yourself and your children! Also, don't forget about Eucharistic Adoration, which is available every Monday (3-8 PM), Thursday (4:30-5:30 PM), as well as at ADORE (7:30 PM, on the First Friday of the Month) and after 8 AM Mass for First Friday and First Saturday.

**TOTUS TUUS 2024:** The past two years, we have had beautiful experiences with Totus Tuus, our weeklong summer program for our children and teenagers. I am pleased to announce that our third annual Totus Tuus week will be July 7-12, 2024. More information to come.

**PARISH MISSION ANNOUNCEMENT:** I am very excited to share with you some more good news. As you may know, our parish has had a long history of taking parishioners to Steubenville Youth Conferences and has even taken groups to some of the conferences for adults hosted by Franciscan University of Steubenville. Well, in November, we will be bringing a taste of that experience home to Geneseo! Our next Parish Mission will be offered by Franciscan University of Steubenville on the week of our next Parish Feast Day (November 3-5, 2024). Kevin Lillis and Julie Atwell will be serving as mission coordinators for this event and they will be assembling a team, which will then reach out to get even more of the parish involved. 

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter into this Lenten season, the Church once again invites us to use this opportunity to share more fully in the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ. It is essential that we cultivate a deeper sense of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to better offer our lives to Our Lord.

As we make our way through the Triduum and to that glorious day of the Lord's Resurrection, I pray that all of us will be ever more attentive to our spiritual devotions and especially to the Word of God during these forty days. May the guidance of the Holy Spirit assist us in our Lenten journey.

#### **REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDUUM**

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and Good Friday, March 29, 2024.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

May our Lenten journey bring us closer to the cross and our Resurrected Savior.

## **Buildings and Grounds Update**

I would like to review some projects that were completed this past year, current projects, and possible future projects at our Parish.

## **Boiler/Frozen Pipes:**

On Christmas Eve last year (December 2022 we experienced -30 degree temperatures for a couple of days which froze and split boiler system water pipes in grades 1 and 2. We were able to stabilize the system and function until spring. In the summer with technical support we found the cause of the problem and this year the system has performed as expected.

\$7,000.00

## Entrance Pillar Replaced:

A few days after Christmas (December 2022) our snow plow contractor made contact with the West pillar of our main entrance leading to the replacement of the pillar. The contractor's insurance paid for the repairs. We also had some material and labor from a few parishioners to temporarily keep the entrance open until the work was completed in April.

\$7,500.00

## **Playground Fence:**

In August of 2023 the Parents Club had a chain link fence installed on the North side of the playground to provide safety and security for our students and others that use our playground. \$9.225.00

## Sound System:

The Parish enhanced our sound system by adding 4 speakers toward the rear of the Nave. The speakers have given us more coverage throughout the church providing a better experience for our worship. \$1,800.00

## Light Bulbs School/Church

We replaced most of the bulbs throughout the church and school for energy efficiency and less maintenance.

## St. Malachy Rectory Garage:

A wall was built in the Rectory's garage to dedicate storage space for the Parish and a separate area for the needs of our Pastor. The materials and labor were donated.

## **Current Projects**

## St. Malachy Rectory:

Our Rectory was built over 30 years ago and updates were lacking, leaving flooring and some walls in disrepair. Additional repurposing of some spaces were needed to meet current needs, including an addition of a chapel. The updating began this past fall and is still in progress. The work includes remodeling the master bedroom and bathroom and adding new cabinets and counter tops for all the bathrooms. New carpet, kitchen flooring, lighting, and a new coat of paint will finish out project. Hope to finish by April 1.

Estimated cost \$50,000.00

## **Stained Glass Windows:**

Currently our contractor Daprato Rigali Inc. of Chicago is choosing the glass and designing the windows for production in the near future. The fund raising has gone well with 141 donations, \$240,125.00 pledged and paid toward the goal of \$257,300.00. The installation will be completed by Christmas 2024. Thank you to all the donors. \$257,300.00

## **Possible Future Projects**

## Window Replacement School/Library/Youth Room:

The Buildings and Grounds Committee is gathering quotes and will be discussing the project at our next meeting, February 22. Our current windows were installed in 1989 and are not performing as we need them to. We can no longer get the replacement parts that we need to keep the windows functional. Estimated cost \$180,000.00

### Sanctuary Tile:

Buildings and Grounds will begin the discussion of replacing the carpet in the Sanctuary with tile. Work to be done next year. Cost???




