Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" (Luke 24:26). In this Year of Missionary Discipleship, we have been exploring all angles of this

story from Easter Sunday, which invites us to discover the "breaking of the bread" as a place of encounter with the Lord, which sends us out to share His Good News. As we begin the desert season of Lent, let us begin to consider this important line, as our seasonal theme verse.

The Lord invites the two disciples on the road, and likewise invites us to consider the necessity of suffering and sacrifice in God's plan, in order to enter into glory. As it is sometimes said, you have to go through Good Friday, in order to get to Easter Sunday. Our Lord certainly did. And yet, we recognize that a longer road still led Him to Good Friday. In particular, let us consider how He prepared for the whole of His three year ministry, which would culminate with His Cross and Resurrection. It was His forty days of fasting and prayer in the desert, which prepared Him. Likewise, we prepare to go to the cross with Our Lord in Holy Week, in order to enter into His glory in Easter, by this forty day season of entering into the desert. Our prayer, fasting and almsgiving are meant to help us to come to the altar hungry on Holy Thursday, when we begin the Sacred Triduum, which draws us into His Passion, Death and Resurrection, especially through the Holy Eucharist. In fact, every Eucharistic celebration invites us into communion with His death and resurrection.

This theme verse helps us to understand how all of Lent is oriented in this direction. By our prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we are preparing to go to the

cross at Holy Week, to "*suffer these things*" with the Messiah and so "*enter into His glory*." Likewise, our theme for this year, **A Three Step Journey**, also helps us understand this. First, we accept the Lord's invitation to "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1), like we hear in the Gospel this weekend. Second, we will "Dive into the Good News," especially through the Gospel of Mark Challenge. Third and finally, these previous steps will have prepared us to "Embrace the Cross" with Christ Our Lord.

Like any other journey, let us take this one step at a time. So, let's consider Our Lord's invitation to "Repent and Believe in the Gospel." The word "repent" simply calls us to turn back to the Lord, which usually involves some kind of change of heart and mind. The catechism gives us a deeper understanding of the meaning of the word "believe." Among other things (CCC 222-227), "It means trusting God in every circumstance, even in adversity. A prayer of St. Teresa of Jesus wonderfully expresses this trust: *Let nothing trouble you, Let nothing frighten you, Everything passes, God never changes, Patience Obtains all, Whoever has God, Wants for nothing, God alone is enough.*" Finally the word "Gospel" reminds us that this is all Good News!

In this first step, we are encouraging our parishioners to make a good confession and receive the grace of this sacrament early in Lent (February 14 -29). Don't wait. The sacrament will remain available after this point, but I encourage you to celebrate it early if you can. As Jesus entered the desert right after His baptism, so let us enter by being restored to the grace of our baptism. This year, we are again doubling the Confession times for Lent: 12-12:30 on Monday-Thursday, in addition to the year round times on Monday (8:45 AM), Tuesday (8:45 AM), Thursday (5 PM) and Saturday (3:30 PM). We will also have a *Holy Hour with Confessions at 7 PM on Thursday*, *February 22nd.* (Continued on page 5)

Let us all return to the Lord with our whole hearts.





John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship Fund Grants Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under the heading Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award. Parents must apply at: https://online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2024-2025 school year must reapply. Deadline date for the completed application is April 26, 2024. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2024.

Another funding opportunity is also available due to the Invest in Kids Act legislation in Illinois. Students may be eligible for up to 100% of tuition and fees under a new program for tax credit scholarships (TCS). Details on how to apply and who qualifies are available on the Empower Illinois website at www.empowerillinois.org. Students who receive a TCS are ineligible to receive a Spalding award.
