Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" (Luke 24:26). With these words, Our Lord pointed out to the two disciples on the road how all of the Scriptures had been leading

up to the Good News, that is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Yet, that Good News would be veiled in suffering. We are invited to dive into this Good News, confident that the end point is that our Messiah would pass through His suffering and enter into glory, in order that we might enter into heavenly glory with Him. Just over a week ago, many of us began the Gospel of Mark Challenge. By this point, that climactic conclusion is drawing very near.

Again, let us remember to pray first and read slowly. And when we find a place where the Lord has moved our hearts, we should consider it like discovering a well, to which we can return often. Try to identify at least one passage per week, to which you will come back and spend quality time.

There is a classic method of Lectio Divina (divine reading, the term used for praying with Sacred Scripture) proposed by Guigo the Carthusian, who lived around the same time as Saint Malachy. This is known as a ladder with four rungs: Lectio (Reading/Listening), Meditatio (Meditation), Oratio (Prayer/Conversation), Contemplatio (Contemplation). In the first step, we simply read through the words of Sacred Scripture, with an attentive mind and heart. In the second step, we begin to meditate upon what we have read, using reason to seek deeper understanding of its meaning, as if seeking out "hidden truth." In the third step, we talk to God about what we have read and meditated upon. How does it move you to make acts of thanks and petition and to engage in a deep conversation with your Blessed Lord? In the final step, we are drawn into completion, simply resting in the sweetness flowing from this time with the Lord, soaking in the joys of everlasting sweetness, in the Lord Himself. This final step is a gift from the Lord, which we cannot force by our own power. We can only receive it from the Lord when He chooses A common summary of these four steps, to give it. paraphrasing Guigo himself says, "Reading seeks, Meditation finds, Prayer knocks, Contemplation tastes."

If you are looking for a whole study in which you can dive deeper into this concept I recommend the *Lectio: Prayer* study on Formed.org. In six sessions, Dr. Tim Gray goes over these four steps in depth, including a fifth step, which others have recommended: Resolutio (Resolution). In this final step, we make a concrete resolution of something we plan to do or change, in response to the reading. I always recommend making such resolutions with the same conviction we express in the Act of Contrition: *"I firmly resolve, with the help of Your Grace..."*

How can this play into the Gospel of Mark Challenge? Think of your reading of the chapter for the day as only the first step in this process. As you read through each chapter, keeping your whole heart attentive to the text, make note of the passages to which you plan to return. When you do return, begin to scale the four (or five) rungs of the ladder. Here we come to a great irony. When we dive into the Good News, we are raised up to the heights of God.

Volunteer Appreciation: This weekend, we are having our Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. I know that not everyone is able to attend. I hope that those who do attend enjoy a night filled with good food, joy and fraternity with your fellow parishioners. Whether you are able to attend or not, I hope that you know that I am very grateful to all of you for all that you do to support the mission of making the Lord Jesus more widely known that He may be greatly loved. There are so many different ways that many of you give of your time, talent and treasure. These gifts and sacrifices do not go unnoticed. I wish there was a better way to reach and thank everyone. But, let me say it one more time: Thank you for all that you do.

Stations for Children: A few weeks ago, I received an inquiry from parents interested in the Stations of the Cross being offered on a Friday in a manner designed to be more accessible to children. After a survey of other parents across both School and CCD, there seems to be a fair amount of interest. Therefore the 7 PM Stations of the Cross on Good Friday (March 29) will be offered in this way. Please mark your calendars and if your child would like to read for one or more of the stations, let the office know. May God's children of all ages together embrace the cross with Jesus!

GROWING DISCIPLES

PASTORAL PLAN FOR THE DIOCESE OF PEORIA

We have several updates regarding our Growing Disciples initiative:

- The Growing Disciples Core Team has met with the Pastoral Commission (comprised of
 parishioners from each vicariate) and the Presbyteral Council (comprised of priests from each
 vicariate) to review the Round Three models it created based on the feedback from the Round
 Two models. All the feedback from both meetings has been submitted to the Bishop to consider
 as part of his discernment.
- The Round Three models recommended to the Bishop by the Core Team will be made public. The Bishop wanted you to see the information he is discerning for several reasons:
 - He is committed to transparency in the Growing Disciples process.
 - There are changes from the Round Two models based on the feedback the Core Team received.
 - It will help all of us begin to work within our parish community and nearby parishes to
 prepare hearts and minds for change. Regardless of what may happen to our parish,
 everyone will experience a change, whether it is a new structure for our parish or the
 parish we grew up in, a new priest, or a renewed commitment and focus to
 evangelization and growing disciples.

The Round Three models will be posted on <u>growingdisciplescdop.org</u> on Sunday, March 10 at 6 pm.

The time for the Bishop's discernment has begun. He will take everything he has heard and seen, revisit notes and letters, and bring it all to prayer. Please pray that the Holy Spirit continues to guide him and the Growing Disciples process.





Your child can attend a Catholic School Financial Assistance Available



John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship Fund Grants Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under the heading Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award. Parents must apply at: https://online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2024-2025 school year must reapply. Deadline date for the completed application is April 26, 2024. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2024.

Another funding opportunity is also available due to the Invest in Kids Act legislation in Illinois. Students may be eligible for up to 100% of tuition and fees under a new program for tax credit scholarships (TCS). Details on how to apply and who qualifies are available on the Empower Illinois website at www.empowerillinois.org. Students who receive a TCS are ineligible to receive a Spalding award.


