

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" (Luke 24:26). As we "Embrace the Cross," let us continue our reflection on the cup that the Lord drank upon the cross. As

we considered last week, Jesus drank the cup of suffering, the cup of wrath spoken of throughout the Scriptures, for all sinners. He had prayed that the cup might pass from Him, but ultimately He embraced the plan of the Father, out of love for Him and for us.

When we consider the connection between this act of drinking and our own thirst, we are led back to the exchange between Our Lord and the sons of Zebedee, James and John. When He asks them if they can drink the cup that He drinks, they confidently respond, "We can" (Mark 10:35-45). Although they did not understand the meaning of these words, we should consider how their response speaks of a thirst that aches deep within our hearts, far beneath the surface. At the surface, our hearts seem to long for the opposite, for pleasure and comfort, rather than suffering and sacrifice. In what sense, then, can we consider the longing to go with Christ to the cross a deep thirst in the human heart?

Our deepest thirst is for the love of God. This is what we hear expressed in Psalm 42: As the deer longs for running waters, so my soul longs for You, O God (the bated breath to go there. inspiration for our upcoming stained glass windows). Although our sin has removed us from God, we long to return to God! Jesus Christ died to make that reconciliation possible. He suffered to bring us home to the Father. The way of the cross is the way of our salvation. It is our path home, where we find the satisfaction of that deepest desire of our hearts. We long to be there with Him. He has been with us in our deepest suffering and so we long to be there with Him in His deepest suffering. We want to express our gratitude and love. We want to console His Heart when He looks around, seeing how many of His friends have abandoned Him and even *feeling* abandoned by God, as He cries out "My God, My God, why have you forsake

*Me*?" (Mark 15:33-37). We want to hear His words of mercy, as He prays, "*Father, forgive them for they know not what they do*" (Luke 23:34) and as He speaks hope to the hearts of all repentant sinners, "*Amen, I say to you, today you will be with Me in paradise*" (Luke 23:43).

While we do not want to suffer, we also do not want to suffer alone and without meaning. Therefore, we long to be able to bring all of our suffering to the cross of Christ, that we may suffer with Him. As we do so, He floods our pain with meaning, as we discover compassion, love and the hope of the Resurrection.

Finally, we long to truly love. "Greater love has no one than this, to lay down His life for His friends" (John 15:13). Christ shows us what it means to truly love, to give of ourselves for God and for others. Saint John Paul II loved to point out what was taught in the Second Vatican Council: "Man, who is the only creature on earth which God willed for itself, cannot fully find himself except through a sincere gift of himself' (Gaudium et Spes 24). We only discover the true love for which our hearts long when we Christ loves learn to love as on the cross

So, yes, as shocking as it may seem, I dare say that our hearts long to go to the cross, to drink with Him the cup that He will drink. Broken by sin and selfishness, we often remain at the surface of our hearts and allow ourselves to be led mostly to seek pleasure and comfort. But, when we plumb the depths and discover the secret place where He has spoken to us and revealed to us the meaning and beauty of His cross, we will wait with

We will conclude this reflection in two weeks, on Divine Mercy Sunday (April 7). Until then, let us be bold and go where He is leading our hearts this Holy Week. Let us go to the cross of Jesus Christ, where He reveals to us the depths of His Love.

HOLY WEEK & EASTER WEEK SCHEDULE CHANGES: We come to the climax of the Church Year, with Holy Week, followed by the Easter Octave (or "Easter Week"). Part of Holy Week includes the Chrism Mass in Peoria on Tuesday, at which the priests of the Diocese together renew the promises of our ordination, as we (Continued on page 5)

commemorate the birth of the priesthood in the first Holy on those three days, including the 5 PM Vigil Mass, which Week (Holy Thursday, specifically) and the bishop blesses normally happens on Saturday, but is canceled. Finally, in the oils to be used for the coming year. This will necessitate order to allow time for holiday travel, Mass on Easter canceling the Noon Confession time on Tuesday, as I will Monday (April 1) will be moved from 8 AM to Noon, with be on my way to Peoria. As always, remember that the Triduum liturgies (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday) take the place of all regularly scheduled liturgies


