A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners.

"No disciple is superior to the teacher: but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." (Luke 6). With these words, the Lord reminds us this weekend that He wants to make us like Himself. This is why He invites us

to join Him in the desert, especially by our prayer, fasting and almsgiving in the desert season of Lent, beginning later this week. The annual call to fasting and almsgiving reminds us that we are called to be willing to make sacrifices and to look for opportunities to serve those in need. Meanwhile, the Gospel of Luke Challenge gives us a great opportunity to answer the Lord's call to deeper prayer. Last week, I began offering guidance about how to pray with Scripture. We will continue that guidance in the coming weeks.

MEDITATION WITH SCRIPTURE: Last week. I spoke of reading as simply the first step in the process of Lectio Divina (divine reading), which is simply prayerfully reading Scripture. Traditionally, we describe this process in five steps: Reading, Meditation, Prayer, Contemplation and Resolution. Since I already addressed "reading" pretty heavily last week, we will discuss step two this week and continue with one step each week, until we have completed the process. The Catechism has much to teach us about meditation. "Meditation is above all a quest. The mind seeks to understand the why and how of the Christian life, in order to adhere and respond to what the Lord is asking. The required attentiveness is difficult to sustain... To meditate on what we read helps us to make it our own by confronting it with ourselves. Here, another book is opened: the book of life. We pass from thoughts to reality. To the extent that we are humble and faithful, we discover in meditation the move-ments that stir the heart and we are able to discern them. It is a question of ADORE at 7 PM on Wednesday, April 2. acting truthfully in order to come into the light: "Lord, what do you want me to do?" There are as many and varied methods of meditation as there are spiritual masters. Christians owe it to themselves to develop the desire to meditate regularly, lest they come to resemble the three first kinds of soil in the parable of the sower. But a method is only a guide; the important thing is to advance, with the Holy Spirit, along the one way of prayer: Christ Jesus. Meditation engages thought, imagination, emotion, and desire. This mobilization of faculties

is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart, and strengthen our will to follow Christ. Christian prayer tries above all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, as in *lectio divina* or the rosary. This form of prayerful reflection is of great value, but Christian prayer should go further: to the knowledge of the love of the Lord Jesus, to union with him" (Expressions of Prayer, CCC 2705-2708). These final words remind us what sets Christian meditation apart from other approaches to meditation, practiced by non-Christian religions. Christian meditation is always aimed at seeking union with God in Jesus Christ. It is not simply about the emptying of ourselves or the quieting of our minds. Any Christians who have engaged in approaches of meditation not focused on the Lord should turn away from this practice and turn toward true Christian meditation. The quieting or centering involved in Christian meditation is always simply a means to the end of seeking union with God. For this reason, allowing the Scriptures to become the object of our meditation is an excellent approach. One method proposed by Saint Ignatius relies heavily on the use of the imagination to place oneself in the scene and truly meet Christ there. This was the sort of approach to which I alluded in my homily last weekend.

LENTEN CONFESSIONS: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important part of Lent, especially as the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that the second precept of the Catholic Church (basic minimum requirements for practicing Catholics) tells us that we "shall confess (our) sins at least once a year," and the third precept implies that our preparation for Easter is a great time to do that (CCC 2042). We will again add weekly Lenten Confession times to the regular schedule, at **12-12:30 on Monday** Thursday. Occasional cancellations will be necessary and will be indicated in the bulletin and other parish communications. Finally, we also offer a special time for Lenten Confessions at
