The Three Pillars of Lent: Prayer, Fasting, & Almsgiving

Fasting & Abstinence: Fasting and abstinence are old traditions in Judeo-Christian history and early Lenten practice. Found in the Scriptures, they offer a way of growing closer to God. Pope Francis reminds us, "Fasting makes sense if it really chips away at our security and, as a consequence, benefits someone else..."

The current regulations are as follows:

- Individuals between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by having only one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
- All over the age of 14 are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent.

In addition to the above traditional forms, try fasting from social media, technology, gossip, and excessive screen time. Fasting reminds us of our hunger for God.

A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end." (John 13:1b). These words come from the beginning of the story of the Last Supper as told in the Gospel of John. As you may be aware, these chapters have

provided various theme verses for us throughout this Year of Eucharistic Spirituality, the third year of our parish observance of the National Eucharistic Revival. This year, we have focused on the theme "United in Love." During Advent and Christmas, through the Presentation, we focused on the example of Mary in being united in love with the Heart of God. This Lent, we will focus on **Jesus, United in Love with the Father, in the Holy Spirit**. In the coming weeks, we will explore this theme more, including eventually exploring how we see it exemplified in our theme verse. First, since we currently have hundreds of parishioners engaged in the Gospel of Luke Challenge, we will continue our series focused on helping us to pray with the Scriptures.

PRAYER WITH SCRIPTURE: We have already begun to consider our reading of the Gospel of Luke as being simply the first step in the process of *Lectio Divina* (divine reading), which is simply prayerfully reading Scripture. Traditionally, we describe this process in five steps: Reading, Meditation, Prayer, Contemplation and Resolution. In the past two weeks, we have addressed Reading and Meditation. Now that we move to the third step, Prayer, a question might arise: Isn't the whole process supposed to be prayer? Well, yes, of course. Prayer is more than speaking to God. It is growing in our relationship with Him, including speaking, listening and simply spending time with Him, just as you would with anyone with whom you wanted to grow into a closer relationship. And that is indeed part of the point of approaching our reading of Scripture as prayer, through this process. However, the word here translated into "Prayer" is "Oratio," which simply refers to speaking. Naturally, there will be a point in our prayer, when we choose to *talk to God*, to put it simply. Of course, this can be out loud or mentally. Either way, we do not want to hold everything inside. Eventually, we have to reach out to the Lord and respond to the One who has been speaking to us. As the Catechism tells us, *"Through his Word, God speaks to man. By words, mental or vocal, our prayer takes flesh. Yet it is most important that the heart should be present to him to*

whom we are speaking in prayer: "Whether or not our prayer is heard depends not on the number of words, but on the fervor of our souls." Vocal prayer is an essential element of the Christian life. To his disciples, drawn by their Master's silent prayer, Jesus teaches a vocal prayer, the Our Father. He not only prayed aloud the liturgical prayers of the synagogue but, as the Gospels show, he raised his voice to express his personal prayer, from exultant blessing of the Father to the agony of Gethsemane," (Expressions of Prayer, CCC 2700-2701). So, slow down, pay attention to what you are reading and meditate on it, engaging *"thought, imagination, emotion and desire"* (CCC 2708). But, don't stop there. Talk to the Lord about your experience. You may know exactly what it is you want to talk to Him about, exactly what He is saying to you through the Scriptures. Or you may want to talk to Him about how you have no idea what His Scriptures today mean or how they relate to your life. Maybe you are wrestling with them and need to talk to Him about that, asking Him for help. Perhaps I can bring this point home by sharing a very personal example from my own recent prayer. One day, I was extremely tired in prayer and I realized that my time of prayer had come to a close. And as I began to speak to Him, my prayer went something like this, "Here we are again, Lord. A whole time of prayer in which I could not keep my mind focused *and I could not even keep my eyes open.*" As soon as I came to those final words, I was stunned. Truth be told, I couldn't finish them, as I was brought back to a powerful experience in prayer at my silent retreat this past fall,

reflecting on the disciples unable to keep their eyes open in the garden, when the Lord reminded me that He never takes His eyes off me, even when I can't keep my eyes open. The consolation that flooded my soul in that moment of remembrance was beyond words. So, whatever it is, however imperfect or embarrassing, talk to the Lord about what is on your mind.

In Memory of Father Pakula, St. Malachy Parish will have a monthly theme to collect items for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry.

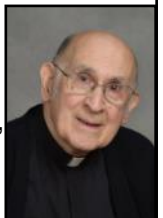

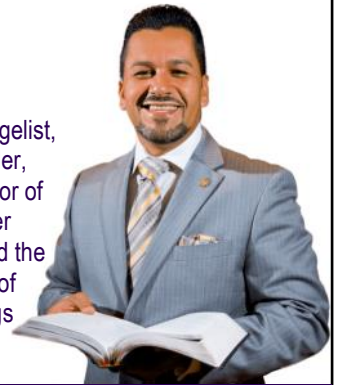
