A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end." (John 13:1b). I can't help but wonder what it was like for Jesus to discover the plan that the Father had for Him. What a fascinating mystery! It opens questions

about the divine and human natures of Jesus, who was One with the Father and yet still had the capacity to learn, to grow and to discover. While we don't know when, where or how it became clear to Him, at some point, He understood that the Father had a plan for Him, which would lead Him... to the cross. The Merciful Heart of the Father was so filled with love for us and compassion for our suffering amidst the plaque of sin that He sent His Son to rescue us. He sent His Son to bring us home, the children who had ungratefully run away from home and squandered our inheritance. And He did all of this, knowing that this would require His Son to lav down His life for us... for you and for me. Still, it gets better. The most amazing part is that when Jesus understood that this was the Father's plan for Him, He said YES! Saint John describes a moment when Jesus had reached this awareness and conviction with those words which serve as our Lenten theme verse for this year (John 13:1b). In the coming weeks, we will explore this theme verse more, including eventually exploring more how it points toward our theme: Jesus. United in Love with the Father, in the Holy Spirit. First, since we currently have hundreds of parishioners finishing up the Gospel of Luke Challenge, we will continue our series focused on helping us to pray with the Scriptures.

LECTIO DIVINA LEADING TO RESOLUTION: We have already begun to consider our reading of the Gospel of Luke as being simply the first step in the process of *Lectio Divina* (divine reading), which is simply prayerfully reading Scripture. Traditionally, we describe this process in five steps: Reading, Meditation, Prayer, Contemplation and Resolution. In the past four weeks, we have addressed Reading, Meditation, Prayer and Contemplation. These four steps are the traditional steps found in "Guigo's Ladder," from Guigo the Carthusian, which most Catholic teachers regard as the principal model for *Lectio Divina*. Some of those same teachers, such as Dr. Tim Gray in his series *Lectio: Prayer* (on Formed), also recommend this fifth and final step. It should be noted that these steps should not be understood as an order

to be rigidly followed. The movement between them may happen fluidly, over a single, slow and thoughtful reading or may happen over multiple readings in succession, with focus on a different step with each reading. This final step is pretty self-explanatory. Our reading and reflection will often call for a response, not only of prayer, but also of action. Whatever you recognize a call to do or change, resolve to do so with the help of God.

MANY THANKS: Thank you for welcoming Fr. John Baptist, as he makes an appeal for his home diocese this weekend (see his letter). Additionally, 2025 has been very busy so far and it is probably overdue for me to stop and offer some thanks. Most recently, I have the Car Party in mind. I am very grateful for all of the hard work of our Parents Club in hosting this great event as our largest annual fundraiser for our school. Likewise, I am very grateful to all who attended the event to support Saint Malachy School. But, I am also thinking of some of the other great events, which have required generous gifts of time, talent and treasure. In January, the Knights of Columbus held a Pancake Breakfast to support our local food pantry, which was well supported. The Welcome Committee offered a free Cinnamon Roll event in February to welcome new parishioners and build community. Finally, also in February, our youth worked very hard to present two events, which ended up being in the same week, due to cancellations for weather: the Kids Carnival and Confirmation Retreat. I am so thankful for the generous stewardship of our parishioners of all ages!

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF SAINT PATRICK: This past week, we celebrated the Feast of Saint Patrick. I would like to welcome you to consider joining me in a pilgrimage to the land of Saint Patrick, Saint Malachy and so many saints it earned the title "the Land of Saints and Scholars," not to mention the cite of Our Lady's appearance in 1879 (Knock, featured in our parish calendar this month). Our pilgrimage to Ireland and Northern Ireland will take place this summer on July 23-31, 2025. See this bulletin for more details and stay tuned for news about an informational meeting this spring.
