

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end." (John 13:1b). As we enter into Passiontide, let us consider the journey of Our Lord to the cross. When John tells the story in his gospel, he uses these

words from which our theme verse comes. To give a bit more context, he writes: "Before the feast of Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to pass from this world to the Father. He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end. The devil had already induced Judas, son of Simon the Iscariot, to hand him over. So, during supper, fully aware that the Father had put everything into his power and that he had come from God and was returning to God, he rose from supper and took off his outer garments. He took a towel and tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and dry them with the towel around his waist" (13:1-5). We are given a glimpse here into the depths of the mind and heart of Christ. He knows that He is One with the Father and is getting ready to return to Him. He understands what this is going to cost Him, both to return to the Father and to reconcile us to Him. As His words at that Last Supper progress, it is clear that He knows, specifically, that Judas will betray Him, Peter will deny Him and all of them will abandon Him in His moment of greatest need. And how does He respond? He washes their feet. Let's



make it more personal. He knows our hearts, yours and mine. He knows our darkest thoughts, deepest fears and most shameful sins. And how does He respond? He lays down His life for us. Not long after that First Eucharist, as the Paschal Mystery was still unfolding, Judas came to the garden with guards ready to take Our Lord away. When Peter rose to His

defense, His response was probably shocking: "Put your sword back into its sheath, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Do you think that I cannot call upon my Father and he will not provide me at this moment with more than twelve legions of angels? But then how would the scriptures be fulfilled which say that it must come to pass in this way?" (Matthew 26:52-54). From these words it is clear that He and the Father are in agreement that this horrible thing is to take place. He has just spent the night in prayer to the Father and He rises in the mighty strength of being united in love with the Father who has sent Him to bring us home. May this union of love with the Father in Jesus Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit, be our strength today.

CATECHUMENS AND CANDIDATES: Now that we are only two weeks away from Easter, I would like to introduce to you those who are preparing to come into the Church and/or receive sacraments in the Easter Season. We have two catechumens preparing for Baptism and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil (April 19): Jennifer Kempher and Tyler Scott. Also at the Easter Vigil, we have two candidates planning to be Confirmed: Hayden CurCuru and Rachael Bauer. Finally, we will have one more being Confirmed on Divine Mercy Sunday (April 27): Addison DePauw. Please keep them in your prayers and join me in welcoming and congratulating them.

COLLEGE VISITS: I am thankful that I had a very good visit to some of our parishioners at Benedictine College (see picture) in Atchison, Kansas, at the end of my short spring break vacation. We enjoyed a nice dinner, did a bit of touring around campus and I was to concelebrate a Mass with them on campus.

THANKS: I want to express my gratitude to everyone who prayed for me, sent cards or gifts or showed me any kindness for my birthday this past week. I am most grateful for the gift of life and I am thankful that the path of my life has led me to you all. The ways of the Lord are beautiful and mysterious.



Dear Monsignors and Fathers,

Our Lenten journey is marked with prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and I am writing to you to ask that you consider offering your prayers and fasting to help us stop the effort to legalize assisted suicide in Illinois. There are two identical pieces of legislation that would legalize assisted suicide in Illinois, SB 9 and HB 1328. Both of these pieces of legislation are currently being presented. In addition to the spiritual practices that we muster against this effort, I ask you to take action by writing, calling or e-mailing your state elected officials to vote "NO" on this legislation. Further information on how to reach your State Senator and State Representative can be found at www.ilcatholic.org or call 217-528-9200.

Assisted suicide makes it legal for a physician to prescribe an array of lethal drugs to a person diagnosed with a terminal disease who requests to end his or her life.

Proponents argue that this legislation will end suffering at the end of life. While we agree that no one should needlessly suffer or have to watch a loved one experience unnecessary pain and suffering, there are now effective ways to make a person more comfortable at the end of life through palliative care. This relatively new specialty utilizes physician-led teams to care for the whole person – physically, emotionally, socially and spiritually – to relieve the symptoms and the stress that often accompany serious illness and side effects of treatment.

It is alarming that in states with legalized suicide, there are documented cases of people being denied life-saving medical treatment by insurance companies in lieu of the much cheaper option of life-ending drugs. The poor and those with disabilities are particularly in jeopardy as they are the most vulnerable to such abuses. Every major national organization that represents people with disabilities is opposed to assisted suicide. There is no way to prevent the vulnerable from being coerced or intimidated to end their lives once assisted suicide is legal.

The American Medical Association (AMA) has summed up the case against assisted suicide well: "Physician assisted suicide is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would provide serious societal risks."

Assisted suicide is not the compassionate solution for those who are suffering. Through palliative care, expanded access to mental health care, stronger family and community support, providers and families are finding better ways to accompany people compassionately demonstrating the love for, and dignity of, each human life.

PONTIFICAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION


