

A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners, "They did not yet understand the Scripture that He had to rise from the dead" (John 20:9). There is often much that we do not yet understand in life. But, it doesn't change this one simple fact:

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

We can have hope, joy and confidence in His Mercy, thanks to His Death and Resurrection. Throughout Lent, we have reflected on the words of John at the start of his description of the Last Supper: *"He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end."* (John 13:1b). This was a part of our focus for this Year of Eucharistic Spirituality, which can more simply be described as being united in love. Our Lord Jesus Christ is not only the source of the grace we seek to be united in love with one another, but also our model. As our Lenten theme emphasized, *Jesus is united in love with the Father in the Holy Spirit*. We see this especially in the Last Supper, as He gives us the gift of the Eucharist and begins His Paschal Mystery. **IRELAN**

Today, as we celebrate the victorious climax of that Paschal Mystery, we again look to His words at the First Eucharist for a theme verse for this Easter Season: "Now the Son of Man has been glorified and God has been glorified in Him" (John 13:31b). Again, we see the union of love between the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. Our Lord Himself insists that the glory given to Him in His Paschal Mystery in turn glorifies the Father. As the Easter Season progresses, we will journey toward the Ascension, when it will become abundantly clear that Jesus wants to take us home to the Father. Finally, in the celebration of Pentecost, we will see how the gift of the Holy Spirit makes it possible for us to remain in Him. This entire Easter Season reveals the desire in

the Heart of God to call us forth from the tomb, that we may live a resurrected life, united in love with Him and with one another in Him. May this desire of God be fulfilled in your life, that you may know the fullness of joy and life that flows from being united in love with the Lord.

Happy Easter!!!


CCD Children are Blooming this Spring in Many Ways!


