A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

Let us continue to read gradually through Pope Leo XIV's very first homily as pope, given to the College of Cardinals, in the Sistine Chapel, the day after his election:


"In a particular way, God has called me by your election to succeed the Prince of the Apostles, and has entrusted this treasure to me so that, with his help. I may be its faithful administrator (cf. 1 Cor 4:2) for the sake of the entire mystical Body of the Church. He has done so in order that she may be ever more fully a city set on a hill (cf. Rev 21:10), an ark of salvation sailing through the waters of history and a beacon that illumines the dark nights of this world. And this, not so much through the magnificence of her structures or the grandeur of her buildings - like the monuments among which we find ourselves — rather through the holiness of her members. For we are the people whom God has chosen as his own, so that we may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called us out of darkness into his marvelous light (cf. 1 Pet 2:9). Peter, however, makes his profession of faith in reply to a specific question: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" (Mt 16:13). The question is not insignificant. It concerns an essential aspect of our ministry, namely, the world in which we live, with its limitations and its potential, its questions and its convictions."

On this Pentecost weekend, we recognize that this world is the mission field that has been entrusted to us and it is His mission that continues, as we seek to help make Him more widely know that He may be greatly loved. This is the reason we were given the Holy Spirit. Let us open our hearts to receive this gift more fully, that His mission may advance in our midst today. "Now the Son of Man has been glorified and God has been glorified in Him" (John 13:31b).

GROWTH CONTINUES: Once the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, the growth of the Newborn Church began immediately. *"Those who accepted (Peter's) message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day"* (Acts 2:41). This growth continues in every generation and we have enjoyed watching it unfold at

Saint Malachy Parish, as ten people have already celebrated the Sacraments of Initiation at our parish, in addition to the infants baptized and the youth in our classes for First Communion and Confirmation, since last Easter. We continue to welcome new young members, as **Henry Pivovarnik** receives his First Holy Communion this weekend at the 10:30 Mass. There are multiple other individuals who are in various stages of preparation at the present moment, at least one of whom we will welcome very soon, so stay tuned. In the meantime, let us welcome Henry and pray for him.


STAINED GLASS WINDOWS: One of the many images of the Holy Spirit that appears in both Scripture and Tradition has been that of living waters. This image is part of what will be depicted in our stained glass windows, focused on Psalm 42: "As the deer longs for the running waters, so my soul longs for You, my God." Last month, some of our parishioners took another visit up to Daprato Rigali Studios (see picture) to learn about the



process and view the progress of the windows. Shortly after that, we were able to begin planning for installation of the windows, which will take place in **September 2025**. We had discussed the possibility of an earlier installation, but we did not want to have scaffolds in the church for weddings or Totus Tuus this summer. Installation is expected to be a two-week process and may involve temporarily blocking off certain pews. Hopefully, you saw the update in January that our fundraising goal has been reached. I am very thankful to everyone who helped us reach that goal, as well as all who engaged with us in...


