



A Letter from the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

Last week as we lifted high the cross, Pope Leo was celebrating his birthday. Let us consider these recent words of his, from the Jubilee Mass for Youth:

"We are not made for a life where everything is taken for granted and static, but for an existence that is constantly renewed through gift of self in love. This is why we continually aspire to something "more" that no created reality can give us: we feel a deep and burning thirst that no drink in this world can satisfy. Knowing this, let us not deceive our hearts by trying to satisfy them with cheap imitations! Let us rather listen to them! Let us turn this thirst into a step stool. like children who stand on tiptoe, in order to peer through the window of encounter with God. We will then find ourselves before him, who is waiting for us, knocking gently on the window of our soul (cf. Rev 3:20) ... Saint Augustine, reflecting on his intense search for God (said): ... "I have tasted you (cf. Ps 34:8: 1 Pt 2:3) now I hunger and thirst for more (cf. Mt 5:6; 1 Cor 4:11); you touched me, and I burned for your peace" (Confessions, 10, 27) ... These are beautiful words and they remind us of what Pope Francis said: ... "We should not be alarmed, then, if we sense an inner thirst, a restless, unfulfilled longing for meaning and a future [...] We should not be lethargic, but alive!" (Address to University Students, 3 August 2023)."

This image of thirst to portray the desire in our hearts for God has been used countless times throughout salvation history, by more than just Pope Leo, Pope Francis and Saint Augustine. In Session Six of the "Psalms: The School of Prayer," part of the Great Adventure Bible Study, Dr. Tim Gray notes this theme of thirst as being central to the entire Book of Psalms. We find it very explicitly in Psalm 42: "As the deer longs for the running waters, so my soul longs for You, O God." However, this theme reaches far beyond the psalms. It is woven throughout so much of Sacred Scripture, as I demonstrated through a variety of reflections in the bulletin since October 2023, when we began speaking in detail about our stained glass windows, depicting Psalm 42.

<u>This week, you will see scaffolding in the church and workers preparing the windows for the installation of these windows.</u> Installation will take place the following week. The

scaffolds will remain up between the two weeks and will limit our seating capacity for next weekend only. May these windows stand as a reminder to all of us of the desire deep within our hearts, which nothing in this world can satisfy. And may this reminder inspire us to seek to grow in prayer and virtue. "If anyone loves righteousness, [Wisdom's] labors are virtues; for she teaches temperance and prudence, justice, and courage" (Wisdom 8:7).

HALLOW PARISH TRIAL: Recently, Saint Malachy began a trial of a parish partnership with the great Catholic meditation app called "Hallow." What is Hallow and what does this parish partnership mean for us? Hallow is an app that has helped many people of all ages grow in prayer. There is a free version and a paid subscription. Even those who only choose to use the free version can access lots of great audio content, which you can see detailed in the bulletin insert. If you choose to get the paid subscription, there is a whole lot more great content! What is the benefit of our trial parish partnership? We have our own parish page on Hallow, where you can connect with each other, ask for prayers, offer your daily prayers on Hallow for each other and see each other's recommendations. This will also give us access to a special parish challenge, which we will offer in November, as well as a challenge that Bishop Lou will be offering now: The Love of the Priesthood. I encourage you to begin using Hallow and become familiar with all that it has to offer. You can find it in the app store of your phone or tablet. Then, connect with "St. Malachy" in the "Community" tab.

NEW MUSIC DIRECTOR: It is my pleasure to share the good news that we have recently hired **Tyler Belanger** as our new Parish Music Director. While he is a new name to our parish, he is local and is a graduate of Geneseo High School. He recently completed a bachelor's degree in Music Theory and Composition and is anxious to put his talent and training to work. After having a chance for him to be evaluated by our Music Director Search Committee and members of our Celebration Choir and to hear their feedback, I am confident and hopeful that Tyler can both maintain the beauty and solemnity that we already enjoy through our sacred music and also help us to keep growing. Please join me in welcoming him.


