

### A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners.

"How desperately our world is thirsting for the hope that only God can provide!" Bishop Daniel E. Thomas reflected on this in the statement from

the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for Respect Life Month, which we quoted last week. Let us thank God that we can encounter the font of Mercy, where this thirst is satisfied, in the Holy Eucharist.

As I ponder the gift of this grace, I am also thankful for the recent addition of our new stained glass windows, which point us to this mystery, by depicting Psalm 42: "As the deer longs for the running waters, so my soul longs for You, O God." The thirst in our hearts leads us to the altar. just as the stream in the windows leads off toward the altar. Now that they have finally arrived, I prudence, justice, and courage" (Wisdom 8:7). wanted to offer this brief reflection as a word of gratitude to God and to all of our parishioners who have made this possible. THANK YOU to the over 180 families who donated toward them and or everyone who offered prayers or support of any kind. Also, thank you to Daprato Rigali Studios for partnering with us to bring these windows to us.

Providentially, since the installation ended up happening during my vacation, my first day having the chance to see them in person, to pray and offer Mass in the church with them installed. was the Feast of Saint Francis. As you may know, Francis had a great love for animals and all of creation, as its beauty pointed him toward the Creator. This is reflected in these windows, as the deer drawn toward the stream are an image for us of the thirst in our hearts for God. And yet, the thirst in our hearts reflects something even greater, as it

points toward the thirst in the Heart of God for our love. He longs to be with us and so He made us long to be with Him. Then, He satisfies our thirst by pouring Himself out in love for us, upon the cross. Thus, we are drawn to the Holy Eucharist, where we are able to drink deep of the Divine Mercy that He has poured out for us. Finally, in the union of love that results, we are poured out with Him to satisfy the needs of our brothers and sisters. Recently, I heard a lyric from the Christian artist Brogan Gaskill, in his song "The Living Well," which summarizes this nicely: "Pour into me, so I can pour mvself out."

May these windows stand as a reminder to all of us of the desire deep within our hearts, which nothing in this world can satisfy. And may this reminder inspire us to seek to grow in prayer and virtue. "If anyone loves righteousness, [Wisdom's] labors are virtues: for she teaches temperance and






