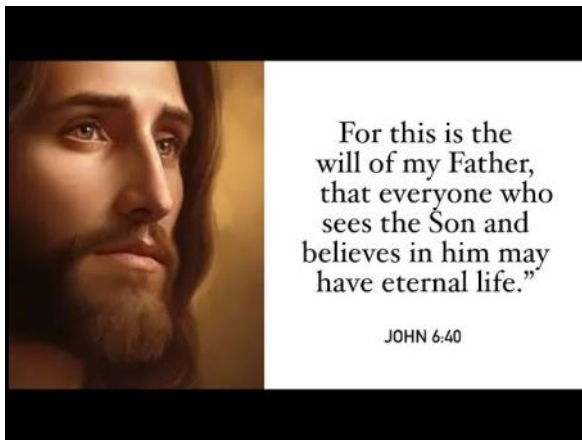

A Letter from the Pastor



Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"The poorest of the poor — those who lack not only material goods but also a voice and the recognition of their dignity — have a special place in God's heart." You may have heard that Pope Leo XIV recently issued his first substantial document, the Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexi Te (I Have Loved You)*. These words from that document offer us a glimpse of the connection of this document to the final Encyclical Letter of Pope Francis, *Delexit Nos (He Loved Us)*, which was focused on the human and divine love of the Heart of Jesus Christ. In the introduction, Pope Leo explains how this document was begun by Pope Francis with the intention of being "in continuity with" that final encyclical letter. *"There we saw how Jesus identified himself 'with the lowest ranks of society' and how, with his love poured out to the end, he confirms the dignity of every human being, especially when 'they are weak, scorned, or suffering.' As we contemplate Christ's love, 'we too are inspired to be more attentive to the sufferings and needs of others, and confirmed in our efforts to share in his work of liberation as instruments for the spread of his love.'"*

He continues, *"God is merciful love, and his plan of love, which unfolds and is fulfilled in history, is above all his descent and coming among us to free us from slavery, fear, sin and the power of death. Addressing their human condition with a merciful gaze and a heart full of love, he turned to his creatures and thus took care of their poverty. Precisely in order to share the limitations and fragility of our human nature, he himself became poor and was born in the flesh like us. We came to know him in the smallness of a child laid in a manger and in the extreme humiliation of the cross, where he shared our radical poverty, which is death. It is easy to understand, then, why we can also speak theologically of a preferential option on the part of God for the poor."*

As we contemplate the dignity of every human person, including the poorest of the poor, *"those who lack not only material goods but also a voice and the recognition of their dignity,"* from the unborn, to the sick and dying, to

immigrants and refugees, to the homeless and hungry, may we remember also our own dignity. May this remembrance inspire us to seek to grow in prayer and virtue. *"If anyone loves righteousness, [Wisdom's] labors are virtues; for she teaches temperance and prudence, justice, and courage"* (Wisdom 8:7).

FEAST DAY AND NOVENA: We will celebrate our Feast Day this year at all weekend Masses for Sunday, November 9th. Thanks to Altar and Rosary, we will again celebrate with a parish breakfast after both Masses on Sunday. Beginning on October 31, we will begin praying the novena prayer at the end of all Masses. Copies of the novena will be available on the information table and sent out digitally for those who would like to pray the full novena. Around the start of the novena (November 1), we will also launch the *How To Pray Challenge* on Hallow.

LITURGICAL MINISTERS RETREAT AND TRAINING DAY: In just a couple of weeks, we will host a Liturgical Ministers Retreat and Training Day for all Lectors, Commentators, Ushers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. We ask all new and veteran ministers in one or more of these ministries to make their best effort to attend. We understand that not all will be available and are planning to make the key information available to those unable to attend. But, the best preparation for future or continued involvement in these ministries will be in-person attendance. We hope you can join us!

HARVEST MASS: On Thursday, November 20, there will again be a Harvest Mass for our vicariate hosted in Woodhull at 6 PM, followed by a potluck. We will move our daily parish Mass that day to 8 AM, in order to avoid conflicts and to encourage parishioners to attend the Harvest Mass. See this bulletin for more information.

St. Malachy Parish has a monthly theme to collect items for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry.

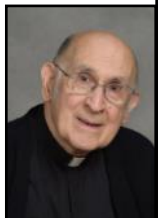
The theme for **November** is:
